

High School Summer School: Summer school is scheduled at the eight comprehensive high schools and one continuation high school. Summer school is available to students who need academic support to pass the California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE), to make up credit in courses required to meet district graduation requirements and to accelerate in core academic courses. Course offerings include English 9 – 12B, Algebra I, Applied Geometry, Geometry, Algebra II, Pre-Calculus, World Geography, World History, U.S. History, General Science, Biology, Chemistry, Spanish I & II, Health, Physical Education, Art 1, Computer Technology and CAHSEE support. Some classes are restricted to make up credit only. Check with your school counselor to determine which classes are restricted.



Elk Grove Unified School District reserves the right to discontinue, combine or relocate classes to another school depending on sufficient student enrollment and the availability of qualified teachers.

There are two registration periods:

- Priority Registration: February 15 – March 15, 2007 for students who need intervention classes or to make up credit
- Final Registration: May 14 – May 25, 2007 for enrichment, intervention and make-up credit.

Registration forms are available at each school's counseling office or the district's Summer School Office. Students are to attend summer school at the high school they currently attend.

High School Enrollment Priorities:

Students who need credit to meet district graduation requirements will have enrollment priority over students enrolling for acceleration. Priority to enroll in summer programs shall be given to district students in the following order:

- 1st priority: Current seniors (class of 2007) who need course credits or CAHSEE remediation in order to graduate from high school by September.
- 2nd priority: Incoming 12th grade students (class of 2008) who are deficient in credits necessary for graduation.
- 3rd priority: Incoming 9th -12th grade students who are eligible for supplemental instruction on the basis of retention, recommendation for retention, or insufficient progress toward passing the state high school exit examination (CAHSEE).
- 4th priority: Incoming 9th – 12th grade students enrolling in courses for acceleration.
- 5th priority: Non- district students who have failed to meet academic requirements, if there are openings after district students have enrolled (BP 6177 a&b).

Continuation High School Summer School: For students currently enrolled at Calvine, Wm. Daylor or Rio Cazadero High Schools.

Term 1: June 18 – July 11, 2007 (No school July 4)

Term 2: July 12 – August 3, 2007

8:30 a.m. – 11:35 a.m. Monday - Thursday

Students attend two 90 minute classes per day and complete 2 hours of independent homework each day. Students may earn a maximum of 10 credits.

Independent Study Program: An independent study program is available to *current 10th – 12th* grade students who currently attend Las Flores Independent Study Program. Students meet with the teacher once a week, then complete assignments independently; therefore students must be self directed and have good time management skills to successfully complete the program.

Comprehensive high school students *may* attend ISP if they meet one or more of the attendance criteria and obtain prior approval from the principal of their home schools

- Health condition that prevents student from attending the comprehensive summer program
- Work schedule that prevents student from attending the comprehensive summer program
- Family responsibilities that prevent student from attending the comprehensive summer program

The independent study program is scheduled at Valley High School.
