Eligibility- Graduating high school seniors who have lived in El Dorado, Placer, Yolo or Sacto. County, CA for at least two years prior to the time of application and also meet California State residency requirements. Students who are planning to enroll full-time at an accredited two-or four- year college, univ. or voc/tech institution located within 100 miles of Sacramento.

Complete Scholarship Questionnaire (designed to collect information about your academic interest, your family profile, your school and community activities, and written responses to questions about current and future plans), have completed questionnaire signed by counselor or school official who can confirm that you meet the program criteria and can report data requested on page 4 of questionnaire. Submit with high school transcripts, test scores, and 2 letters of recommendation. Financial need will be taken into consideration and information to support that need will be requested from the finalists.

The RMHC National Scholarship Program is comprised of 4 individual scholarship programs including: **RMHC/ASIA**, **RMHC/African American Future Achievers**, **RMHC/HACER**, **RMHC Scholars**

eligibility- High school seniors who will be attending a two- or four- year accredited college or university in the academic year following their selection. Must be a legal resident. Verification of enrollment is required.

Additional Eligibility Requirements- For each individual scholarship program the following are also required: **RMHC/ASIA** - applicant must have at least one parent of Asian/Pacific-Islander heritage; **RMHC/African American Future Achievers** - applicant must have at least one parent of African American or Black Caribbean heritage; **RMHC/HACER**-applicant must have at least one parent of Hispanic heritage; **RMHC/Scholars** - ALL students may apply regardless of race, color, creed, religion, sexual orientation, gender, disability or national origin.

requires - completed application; sealed transcript with GPA, rank, and test scores; applicant's personal statement that provides information about their community involvement, career goals, and desire to contribute to their community, information about unique personal or financial circumstances may be added ; and a 1-page letter of recommendation from a teacher or school official. Letter should detail the applicant's background, achievements, leadership abilities, and community involvement, and should contain personalized information about the applicant; copy of the parents' or guardians' IRS Form 1040 used to document total income.

-General Scholarships - open to any graduating African American high school senior who has a minimum 3.0 GPA and has career goals that require education beyond high school. **Preference to those students who plan to major in an area other than performing arts or vocational training.**
