

For the 2009-2010 Summer School program the district's focus is on providing opportunities and equal access to our students in the areas of:

- CAHSEE support
- English Language Arts and Math intervention
- Make-up credit
- Limited enrichment/Acceleration
- Bridge program between middle school and high school

HIGH SCHOOL SUMMER SCHOOL ENROLLMENT PRIORITIES

Priority to enroll in summer programs shall be given to district students currently enrolled in an EGUSD school, in the following order:

1. Current year seniors who need course credits or CAHSEE remediation in order to graduate by September;
2. Incoming 12th grade students who are deficient in credits necessary for graduation;
3. Incoming 9th-12th grade students eligible for supplemental instruction on the basis of retention, recommendation for retention, or insufficient progress toward passing CAHSEE;
4. Incoming 9th-12th grade students enrolling in courses for acceleration on a first-come first-served basis.

Location

Summer school programs will be offered at all nine comprehensive high schools and Las Flores High School. Students shall take courses at their 2008-2009 home school. There will be a limited number of courses offered regionally.

MIDDLE SCHOOL SUMMER SCHOOL ENROLLMENT PRIORITIES

Priority to enroll in summer programs shall be given to district students currently enrolled in an EGUSD school, in the following order:

1. Current 8th grade students who need course credit to promote to the next grade level;
2. Incoming 7th and 8th grade students who are eligible for supplemental instruction on the basis of retention, recommendation for retention, or academic deficiency based on the CST.

Summer school programs will be offered at all nine middle schools.

- Registration will take place on each middle school campus.
- Applications will be available at each middle school site.

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL SUMMER SCHOOL ENROLLMENT PRIORITIES

Priority to enroll in summer programs shall be given to district students currently enrolled in an EGUSD school, in the following order:

1. Current 6th grade students who are being retained;
2. Incoming 2nd-6th grade students who are recommended for retention or are at risk of being retained;
3. Incoming 2nd-6th grade students who have demonstrated academic deficiency based on the CST.

2. Summer classes for core academic subjects may be open to non-district students who do not reside in the EGUSD boundaries and who have failed to meet academic requirements.

NOTE: Transportation to and from school is the responsibility of the parent and/or students. Transportation may be provided for some special education program students who meet specific requirements.
