



# After School Education and Safety Program

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## What is the ASES Program?

The After School Education and Safety (ASES) Program and 21st Century Community Learning Centers are federally funded programs administered by the California State of Education. It is the intent of the ASES legislation to provide a safe place for all students during the after school hours until 6:00 pm.

The ASES/21st CCLC Programs are an after-school program designed to provide a safe learning environment for all students. The programs offer 1st-6th tutoring and homework help, enrichment activities. There are several components in the ASES/21st CCLC programs that include tutoring/ homework assistance in the core subjects (language arts, math, history/ social science, etc., and an educational enrichment component that offers students engaging activities in a variety of areas (fine arts, physical activity, career technical education, prevention strategies, etc.)

ASES/21st CCLC afterschool programs are located at 17 elementary and 3 middle schools that serve high poverty neighborhoods. The use of volunteers, donated services, materials and goods help stretch each dollar that is used to provide services. The EGUSD ASES/21st CCLC programs have partnerships with California State University, Sacramento, Safeway Stores, Home Depot, local fire departments, and many other local businesses and agencies.

## Who Participates?

Each site is overseen by an ASES/Pre K Coordinator and site clerk. Students in first through grades six attend. They are taught and tutored by instructional assistants, bilingual teaching associates, certificated and retired teachers, and local college students completing community service hours.

## When Are Classes Held?

The ASES/21st CCLC Programs are open every day that school is in session, and begins from the end of the regular school day until 6:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Pre-registration for ASES is required and parents are expected to attend an orientation explaining ASES program guidelines.

## Why Do Students Participate?

To have a safe place to go to after school until 6:00 p.m. daily and to take advantage of homework support and enriching opportunities in both social and academic areas.
