School Facility Conditions and Planned Improvement

Cosumnes River Elementary School is located in Sloughhouse, California along the untamed Cosumnes River. Ours is one of the oldest schools in EGUSD, officially becoming a part of the district over 66 years ago. We also have one of the district's newest facilities, a state of the art campus that opened in 2010. Our campus has a two-story classroom building housing up to 20 classrooms in grades 1-6, a science lab, music room, and dedicated PE classroom. Our kindergarten wing has three classrooms and an office space, enough space to accommodate 6 kindergarten classes on an early/late schedule. Additionally, we have a multipurpose room, a library/computer lab/learning center facility, and an administration building. Our long-time campus partner, YMCA, provides fee-based after school childcare on campus in three portables located within the secured part of our campus. We have a large blacktop designed for multi-game basketball, tetherball, 4-square, and kickball. We also have a play structure and large grass field with surrounding track for use during recess and physical education.

The district's maintenance and grounds departments work in concert with our custodial team to ensure that school buildings, classrooms, and grounds are maintained at exceptional levels to provide a safe and functional environment for all students. The district utilizes the latest electronic work order system enabling site administration and custodians to communicate maintenance needs, urgent repairs, or necessary projects. Emergency repair needs are quickly resolved by our custodian or district maintenance staff. Our custodians work as a team and with the principal to develop a daily cleaning process and schedule. Each morning the custodian inspects the school prior to students and staff entering school grounds. Restrooms are inspected throughout the day to ensure that they are adequately stocked, safe, and sanitary. The EGUSD Board of Education has adopted cleaning standards for all schools in the district. A summary of these standards is available at the school office or at the district office.

Measure M funds will allow us to add an additional shade structure to our blacktop area to provide additional bench seating and shade for all of our students. The CRES PTA is providing new picnic benches for the additional shade structure when they are installed. A new solid shed was installed near our CRES garden to house tools and equipment for our afterschool garden program. A CRES PTA funded "hydration station" is located in our cafeteria for student and staff use.

In the 2019-2020 school year, over 99 percent of the district's teachers held full teaching credentials. In addition to being fully credentialed, if a class is 20 percent or more English Learners (EL), the teacher should hold a supplementary authorization to instruct students in learning English or they are considered misassigned.

In subjects with a shortage, a fully credentialed teacher is sometimes asked to teach outside of their subject matter competency area until an appropriately credentialed teacher can be hired. In these cases, teachers are counted as misassigned.

Vacancies are defined as a position to which a permanent teacher has not been assigned by the beginning of the course. Most vacancies in our district are in subject areas where qualified teachers are in shortage.

For the 2020 - 2021 school year, class sizes are 24 to 1 in Transitional Kindergarten through 3rd grade, and 28 to 1 in 4th through 6th grades.

Professional Development

Our school offers a variety of professional learning opportunities for teachers, paraeducators, and non-instructional support staff. Our school has monthly professional learning activities and PLC grade level meetings with a focus on student learning. Teaching teams use this time to review student work, make determinations about students' strengths and weaknesses, and plan instruction to meet the needs of all students. Support staff may receive training in CPR, first aid, behavior management, safety procedures, and mandated reporting.

Our teachers also take part in district sponsored ELA and mathematics professional learning that supports the implementation of Common Core State Standards, as well as NGSS. The focus is on curriculum implementation (Wonders & Go Math) and best teaching practices. Additionally, professional learning opportunities are offered to staff to support our English Language learners, students with disabilities, and PBIS.

New teachers who have been teaching less than two years are supported by the district's BTSA program.

School Safety Plan

At CRES, we believe that a safe, positive, equitable learning environment is essential to student success. Our staff and School Site Council reviewed and updated our Comprehensive Safe School Plan in January 2021. Our students and staff participate regularly in evacuation and lockdown drills. An "Emergency Kit," with a flipchart to reference emergency protocols, as well as accountability forms are easily accessible in every classroom. Our students are supervised both before and after school and gates are kept locked throughout the day. Visitors are required to check-in through the school office and receive a volunteer or visitor's badge before exiting out onto campus.

Specialized Programs

CRES has a highly qualified staff to assist students with special learning needs. Our Learning Center provides both "push-in" and "pull-out" services for our special education students reporting progress toward goals on a regular basis. Our English learners receive thirty minutes of English Language Development (ELD) instruction per day to support language acquisition skills and our Gifted and Talented (GATE) students participate in differentiated instruction in their regular classrooms. Visual and Performing Arts (music, theater, art) is infused throughout the regular instructional day and evidence is seen in student artwork throughout the campus and performances held in classrooms and our multipurpose room each trimester. CRES is proud of its student athletes with high percentages of fifth graders mastering 5 of 6 physical fitness standards. Our Physical Education program and afterschool athletic clubs support our families' priority of raising healthy and fit children.
