School Highlights and Awards

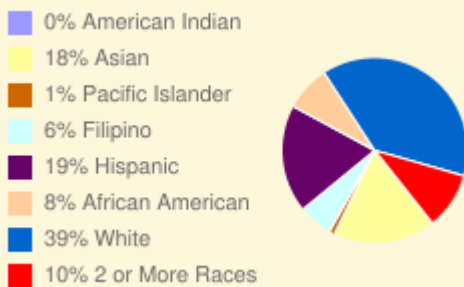
Our school has been the recipient of several achievement awards and State and District recognition programs. Elk Grove Elementary School consistently performs well on state and national standardized tests.

In the 2015-2016 school year, over 99 percent of the district's teachers held full teaching credentials. In addition to being fully credentialed, if a class is 20 percent or more English Learners (EL), the teacher should hold a supplementary authorization to instruct students in learning English or they are considered misassigned. Our district is working to remedy these misassignments by providing training opportunities for teachers to earn these authorizations and providing ongoing professional development in strategies to help EL students.

In subjects with a shortage, a fully credentialed teacher is sometimes asked to teach outside of their subject matter competency area until an appropriately credentialed teacher can be hired. In these cases, teachers are counted as misassigned.

Vacancies are defined as a position to which a permanent teacher has not been assigned by the beginning of the course. Most vacancies in our district are in subject areas where qualified teachers are in shortage.

School Facility Conditions and Planned Improvement

Elk Grove Elementary School has 32 classrooms, one learning center room, a multipurpose room, a library, computer room, and an administration building. The main campus was built in 1992.

During the summer of 2012-2013 9 rooms were re-designed and enlarged creating 6 primary classrooms. 7 new classrooms were added to the school during this time when Elk Grove Elementary returned to a traditional school schedule from a year-round schedule.

Our school is beautifully landscaped and enjoys a well-designed playground, field and track.

Four outdoor tables and benches are located under mature shade trees offering outdoor learning experiences for many of our kids.

The district's maintenance and grounds departments work in concert with our school site custodial team to ensure that school buildings, classrooms, and grounds are maintained at exceptional levels to provide a safe and functional environment for all students. The district utilizes the latest electronic work order system enabling site administration and custodians to communicate maintenance needs, urgent repairs, or necessary projects. Emergency repair needs are immediately resolved by either the school custodian or district maintenance staff. The school's custodians work as a team and with the principal to develop a daily cleaning process and schedule. Each morning the custodian inspects the school prior to students and staff entering school grounds. Restrooms are inspected throughout the day to ensure that they are adequately stocked, safe, and sanitary. The Board of Education has adopted cleaning standards for all schools in the district. A summary of these standards is available at the school office, or at the district office.

Currently no new building projects are underway. Over the summer of 2015, Elk Grove Elementary School's PTA upgraded our entire sound system in the Multi-Purpose room.

In Elk Grove schools, our research shows that small class sizes lead to higher student engagement and academic achievement. It has been a top priority in our district to reduce class sizes. For the 2016-2017 school year, class sizes are 24 to 1 in Transitional Kindergarten through 3rd grade, and 28 to 1 in 4th through 6th grades.

Professional Development

Our school and district offer a variety of professional learning opportunities for teachers, para-educators, and non-instructional support staff. For 2015-2016, our school will provide professional development in Math and English language arts.

Professional Learning Communities (PLC's) are in place at every grade level focusing on enhancing the instructional program and the ongoing improvement of academic achievement.

School Safety Plan

The safety of your child, visitors, and the staff at Elk Grove Elementary is our first priority. Our students require a safe, orderly, secure and comfortable environment in which to learn. An "Emergency Handbook", outlining a plan of action for emergencies such as earthquakes, fires, floods, and chemical spills, and a "Crisis Response Box" are kept in the school office. Each classroom has emergency procedures posted. Monthly fire, disaster, earthquake, and intruder drills are held. Gates are kept closed and locked.

Visitors must check in at the office. The district's Police Services Department also works closely with our school site and is available to assist in providing a safe, secure environment for all students. We reviewed our Site Safety Plan in May of 2016 to ensure it continues to meet the needs of our school community. Included in the plan are monitoring practices that not only address student safety during school hours, but before and after school as well.

Specialized Programs

At Elk Grove Elementary highly qualified staff are assigned to assist students with special learning needs. Our Learning Center serves special education students.

Elk Grove Elementary School offers after school team sports, student leadership, and provides support through the Elk Grove Community Service's Kid's Central Program.

Programs for G.A.T.E. will have been fully implemented during the 2016-2017 school year. Our level one and level two English Language Learners (ELL) students receive 40 minutes of leveled English language instruction four days a week through the Avenues program and in-class instruction.

Summer School was provided during the summer of 2016 and will be available in the summer of 2017. Summer school was well attended and focused on remedial and enrichment opportunities for students in grade first through sixth.
