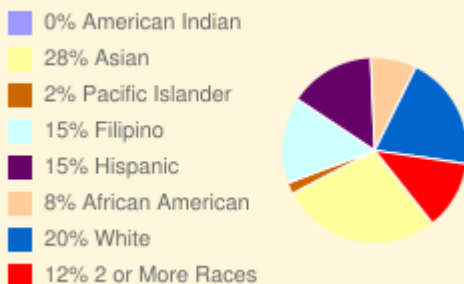

In the 2015-2016 school year, over 99 percent of the district's teachers held full teaching credentials. In addition to being fully credentialed, if a class is 20 percent or more English Learners (EL), the teacher should hold a supplementary authorization to instruct students in learning English or they are considered misassigned. Our district is working to remedy these misassignments by providing training opportunities for teachers to earn these authorizations and providing ongoing professional development in strategies to help EL students.

In subjects with a shortage, a fully credentialed teacher is sometimes asked to teach outside of their subject matter competency area until an appropriately credentialed teacher can be hired. In these cases, teachers are counted as misassigned.

Vacancies are defined as a position to which a permanent teacher has not been assigned by the beginning of the course. Most vacancies in our district are in subject areas where qualified teachers are in shortage.

School Facility Conditions and Planned Improvement

This school has 35 classrooms, a learning center, a multipurpose room, a library, and an administration building. The campus was built in 2003. Our school has two playground areas with multiple surfaces for students.

The district's maintenance and grounds departments work in concert with the school site custodial team to ensure that school buildings, classrooms, and grounds are maintained at exceptional levels to provide a safe and functional environment for all students. The district utilizes the latest electronic work order system enabling site administration and custodians to communicate maintenance needs, urgent repairs, or necessary projects. Emergency repair needs are immediately resolved by either the school custodian or district maintenance staff. The school's custodians work as a team and with the principal to develop a daily cleaning process and schedule. Each morning the custodian inspects the school prior to students and staff entering school grounds. Restrooms are inspected throughout the day to ensure that they are adequately stocked, safe, and sanitary. The Board of Education has adopted cleaning standards for all schools in the district. A summary of these standards is available at the school office or at the district office.

There are no planned facilities projects for the 16-17 school year.

For the 2016-2017 school year, class sizes are 24 to 1 in Transitional Kindergarten through 3rd grade, and 28 to 1 in 4th through 6th grades.

Professional Development

For 2016-2017 school year, our school has a professional development emphasis in our Common Core State Standards, as well as in instructional strategies for closing the Achievement Gap. We are focused on Explicit Direct Instruction as well as Visible Learning. Teachers meet weekly during Early Out Wednesdays to review student work, make determinations about students' strengths and needs, and to plan subsequent instruction. Teachers participate in additional professional training through site and district-offered trainings. This year teachers have participated in a variety of workshops focused on our new reading and language arts curriculum - Wonders.

Finally, the district offers a variety of classes for support staff. Instructional aides, school secretaries, office clerks, and custodians may take classes that relate to their work such as learning new computer skills and learning to work more efficiently and in ergonomically correct ways.

School Safety Plan

Your child's safety is important to us at Arlene Hein Elementary School. Our students are supervised both before and after school and our campus is locked during the entire learning day. Visitors must sign in as they enter our office. Our district is committed to providing a safe, secure environment for learning. An "Emergency Handbook," outlining a plan of action for emergencies such as earthquakes, fires, floods, and chemical spills is kept in the school office and in each classroom. Random periodic school safety inspections are conducted by the County of Sacramento, and school wide safety drills are held monthly. The district's Police Services Department works closely with our school site to provide a safe, secure environment for all students. Our School Safety Plan was updated and reviewed with staff in February 2016.

Specialized Programs

At Arlene Hein Elementary, we have highly qualified staff to assist students with special learning needs. Our Learning Center services not only special education students, but also general education students who need additional support to meet grade level standards. Gifted and Talented students participate in accelerated instruction within their classrooms and during extended day. Students who need extra tutoring or homework help can participate in extended day programs. We provide instruction in the Visual and Performing Arts through our classroom "Art Docent" program which teaches students about fine arts as well as instruction in drama through a credentialed drama instructor. Finally, we provide our English Learners with ELD instruction during a daily instructional period called WIN (What I Need).
