In the 2015-2016 school year, over 99 percent of the district's teachers held full teaching credentials. In addition to being fully credentialed, if a class is 20 percent or more English Learners (EL), the teacher should hold a supplementary authorization to instruct students in learning English or they are considered misassigned. Our district is working to remedy these misassignments by providing training opportunities for teachers to earn these authorizations and providing ongoing professional development in strategies to help EL students.

In subjects with a shortage, a fully credentialed teacher is sometimes asked to teach outside of their subject matter competency area until an appropriately credentialed teacher can be hired. In these cases, teachers are counted as misassigned.

Vacancies are defined as a position to which a permanent teacher has not been assigned by the beginning of the course. Most vacancies in our district are in subject areas where qualified teachers are in shortage.

School Facility Conditions and Planned Improvement

The district takes great efforts to ensure that all schools are clean, safe, and functional. To assist in this effort, the district uses a facility survey instrument developed by the State of California Office of Public School Construction.

Our beautiful campus was built in 1999-2000, with Stone Lake Elementary opening their doors in August 2000. In 2003-2004 a new kindergarten classroom was added to our campus. We have 28 classrooms; a large multipurpose room, which also houses our stage and kitchen; a computer lab with 41 computers; and a library with over 13,000 volumes and 10 computers for student's use. We are proud of our campus and strive to keep our school in good repair so it is clean, safe, functional, and provides an orderly environment for teaching and learning.

During the 2015-2016 school year, our PTO purchased a permanent shade structure for our kindergarten play area. This provides shade for the table area where our kinder students eat their snack each day.

District maintenance staff ensures that the repairs necessary to keep the school in good repair and working order are completed in a timely manner. A work order process is used to ensure efficient service and that emergency repairs are given the highest priority. The district governing board has adopted cleaning standards for all schools in the district. A summary of these standards is available at the school office or the district Facilities Department. The principal works with the custodial staff to develop cleaning schedules to ensure a clean and safe school.

There are no corrective maintenance issues at this time. However, during this school year the majority of our site received a computer refresh. This refresh updated the computers in teacher classrooms and the front office.

In Elk Grove schools, our research shows that small class sizes lead to higher student engagement and academic achievement. It has been a top priority in our district to reduce class sizes. For the 2016-2017 school year, class sizes are 24 to 1 in Transitional Kindergarten through 3rd grade, and 28 to 1 in 4th through 6th grades.

Professional Development

Our school and district offer a variety of professional learning opportunities for teachers, instructional aides, and non-instructional support staff. For the 2016-2017 school year, our district and our school site have offered teachers professional learning opportunities in the areas of Reading Wonders, PLC work and continued professional learning opportunities around our new Go Math curriculum.

New teachers who have been teaching fewer than two years are supported by the district's beginning teacher program. They meet weekly with an experienced mentor to discuss their successes and challenges.

The district offers a variety of classes for support staff. Instructional aides, school secretaries, office clerks, and custodians may take classes that relate to their work such as learning new computer skills and learning to work more efficiently and in ergonomically correct ways.

School Safety Plan

Safety is the number one priority for all staff at Stone Lake Elementary School. Students are supervised before and after school by our staff, which includes school administration. Staff are located at various points around the school. Our school gates are locked daily at 8:10 AM, and all visitors arriving at our school must check-in through the office and receive a visitor's badge.

Our staff reviewed our School Safety Plan in March of 2016. Every common area of our school has an Emergency Guidelines Flipchart for quick reference in emergency situations. Our school has regularly scheduled emergency drills so that we practice what needs to be done in all emergency situations.

Our school site is also supported by our district's Police Services Department.

Specialized Programs

We have highly qualified staff to assist students with special learning needs. Stone Lake offers two Autistic Spectrum Disorder classes. In addition, this year our school also added an Integrated Preschool Class.

Our Learning Center services special education students and general education students who need additional support to meet the standards. We also offer English Language Development support for our limited English speakers. Our school also utilizes the services of a speech specialist to offer support for students with speech and language needs. In addition, Stone Lake has also secured the services of a Mental Health Therapist to offer support for our students as well.
