Welcome to Sunrise Elementary School!

Sunrise Elementary is a school committed to serving the needs of the whole child. With a curriculum that is focused on the California Common Core grade level standards, our students enjoy strong academic success. We have also sought out opportunities to develop our children's well roundedness with instruction in technology, physical activity, leadership, character development and the visual and performing arts.

In addition to our exemplary academic and social-emotional programs, newcomers are attracted to the strong sense of community present on campus and in our school-wide events. This sense of community has continued to flourish even as the school has grown and changed over the years.

In addition to instruction in Language Arts and Mathematics, Science, Social Science, and technology instruction play a significant role in our curriculum. Every student has access to computers or Chromebook tablets and all 1st-6th Graders receive instruction in our computer lab from our computer resource teacher. Our librarian and collection of library books helps students to read and learn in a variety of genres on a range of topics. The Accelerated Reader Program encourages our 2nd-6th grade students to read often and widely.

Our parent community takes an active role in our school, taking elected positions on the Parent Faculty Organization, ELAC and School Site Council, raising and donating funds and supplies, volunteering in classrooms, teaching Art Docent lessons, and chaperoning field trips. Our 5 STAR Families are celebrated annually.

As a result of the commitment and professionalism of the school staff and the strong support of the community, Sunrise has prospered through budget cuts, growth, and changes to the school calendar. The 2017-18 school year marks our fourth year on a four track year round schedule. It is through our joint commitment to the education of children that we continue to maintain the fabric of our school, the quality of our instructional programs, and our overall purpose to see every child reach their greatest potential.

In the 2016-2017 school year, over 99 percent of the district's teachers held full teaching credentials. In addition to being fully credentialed, if a class is 20 percent or more English Learners (EL), the teacher should hold a supplementary authorization to instruct students in learning English or they are considered misassigned. Our district is working to remedy these misassignments by providing training opportunities for teachers to earn these authorizations and providing ongoing professional development in strategies to help EL students.

In subjects with a shortage, a fully credentialed teacher is sometimes asked to teach outside of their subject matter competency area until an appropriately credentialed teacher can be hired. In these cases, teachers are counted as misassigned.

Vacancies are defined as a position to which a permanent teacher has not been assigned by the beginning of the course. Most vacancies in our district are in subject areas where qualified teachers are in shortage.

## School Facility Conditions and Planned Improvement

Sunrise Elementary is nestled in the heart of the still growing Anatolia neighborhood in the city of Rancho Cordova. Our school campus has 40 classrooms including a Learning Center, multipurpose room, library, computer lab and our administration building. The main campus was built in 2006-2007 and we celebrated our 10th anniversary this year. There are two playground spaces, one for kindergarten, and a second for Grades 1-6 that includes basketball, tetherball, and four square courts. A running and walking track surrounds our expansive playfield and grassy area.

The district's maintenance and grounds departments work in concert with the school site custodial team and site administrators to ensure that school buildings, classrooms, and grounds are maintained at exceptional levels to provide a safe and functional environment for all students. The district utilizes the latest electronic work order system enabling site administration and custodians to communicate maintenance needs, urgent repairs, or necessary projects. Emergency repair needs are immediately resolved by either the school custodian or district maintenance staff. The school's custodians work as a team with the administrators to develop a daily cleaning process and schedule. Each morning the custodian inspects the school prior to students and staff entering school grounds. Restrooms are inspected throughout the day to ensure that they are adequately stocked, safe, and sanitary. The Board of Education has adopted cleaning standards for all schools in the district. A summary of these standards is available at the school office, or at the district office.

With our EGUSD bond measure passing last year, our school is slated for improvements including an updated sports track and covered shade structure for our playground. The bond will also help modernize and make repairs possible for all existing EGUSD school sites. Thank you to the EGUSD community for passing this important bond to improve the existing infrastructure and facilities for our children.

## Professional Development

Professional development for the 2017-18 year has been centered on understanding and implementing the Common Core State Standards (CCSS) in Language Arts and Mathematics, integrating English Language Development practices into the instructional day through Guided Language Acquisition and Design strategies and transforming our teams into professional learning communities. EGUSD provided its teaching staff with two full days of professional training prior to the start of school during preservice days as well as On Grade Level Training for K-3 teachers. During the 17-18 school year, our Leadership Team had the opportunity to further develop and strengthen our collective practice and vision around professional learning communities to ensure that every child learns in meaningful and relevant ways and at high levels. Our Computer Resource Teacher also participated in trainings related to student use of the Google Docs platform, and integrating technology. Additionally, we were provided an instructional coach to work alongside our teaching staff and to strengthen our collective practices.

## School Safety Plan

The Sunrise Elementary Safety Plan was reviewed and goals were updated in March of 2017. Our current Safety Plan will be reviewed and updated in February of 2018. Safety drills that address a variety of possible situations are taught and practiced monthly. Our campus is also fenced and gated. During the school day, parents and visitors must enter and sign in through the school office. Staff members provide supervision before and after school during arrival and dismissal times to ensure that all children are safe. We continue to work with our students, community, and law enforcement around issues related to traffic safety and safe routes to school in the community. Additional goals focus on providing students with instruction on topics such as Bullying, Stranger Danger, Bicycle Safety, Fire Safety, and Internet and Cyber Safety.

## Specialized Programs

At Sunrise Elementary we have highly qualified staff to assist students with special learning needs. Our Learning Center and inclusion teachers support the learning needs of identified special education students as well as additional students identified through our co-op process.

GATE students have many opportunities to stretch their thinking and be challenged in after school activities. Games of strategy, creative writing, and STEAM activities allow gifted students a chance to collaborate with their peers.

Students who need support in learning to speak, read, and write English receive daily instruction during WIN time using specialized curriculum and strategies.

Students in grades 1-6 receive instruction in the application of technology in our computer lab. Students learn keyboarding, word processing, spreadsheets, the use of graphics programs, PowerPoint presentation, training in the Google platform, as well as safe use of the Internet.
