- By May of 2027, SWD meeting or exceeding standards on the ELA CAASPP will increase from 34% to 37%.
- By May of 2027, SWD meeting or exceeding standards on the Math CAASPP will increase from 17% to 20%.
- By May of 2027, chronic absenteeism for SWD will decrease from 24% - 21%.
