#### 2. Impact of LCAP and Annual Update

#### How did these consultations affect the LCAP for the upcoming year?

**School Site Council:** Parents expressed continued concerns with student performance levels in math. **Staff:** 100% of staff believe students benefit from AVID. 46% reported students "significantly" benefit from AVID. 97% of staff believe students benefit from After School Tutoring. 40% believe students "significantly" benefit from After School Tutoring.

**ELAC:** Parents did not offer any suggestions or comments regarding the EL program or supports.
