Examples of our success in implementing the district's mission include our practice of mastery learning, which focuses on teacher feedback and student work revision towards 80% mastery of standards. In addition, we have enhanced parent/school communication through the use of Synergy Parent/ue/Student/Uue, a web-based program that allows parents, students, and school personnel to communicate daily regarding student assignments and performance. Parental Involvement

Parents are an integral part of our learning community. Teacher Credentials and Misassignments

In the 2022-2023 school year, over 99 percent of the district's teachers held full teaching credentials. In addition to being fully credentialed, if a class is 20 percent or more English Learners (EL), the teacher should hold a supplementary authorization to instruct students in learning English or they are considered misassigned. In subjects with a shortage, a fully credentialed teacher is sometimes asked to teach outside of their subject matter competency area until an appropriately credentialed teacher can be hired. In these cases, teachers are counted as misassigned.

Vacancies are defined as a position to which a permanent teacher has not been assigned by the beginning of the course. Most vacancies in our district are in subject areas where qualified teachers are in shortage.

School Facility Conditions and Planned Improvement

Katherine L. Albiani Middle School, also known as KAMS, has been open since 2005. The school has 51 classroom spaces, computer lab, multipurpose room, gymnasium with locker rooms, dance room, band/music room, outdoor & indoor stage, shared library with the high school, student services building and an administration building. The campus also consists of a blacktop area with multiple basketball courts, a track, and a large field area for physical education instruction as well as after school sports.

The district's maintenance and grounds departments work with the school site custodial team to ensure school buildings, classrooms, and grounds are maintained at exceptional levels to provide a safe and functional environment for all students. The district utilizes an electronic work order system enabling site administration and custodians to communicate maintenance needs, repairs, or necessary projects. The school's custodians work as a team and with the principal to develop a daily cleaning process and schedule. Each morning the custodian inspects the school prior to students and staff entering school grounds. Restrooms are inspected throughout the day to ensure that they are adequately stocked, safe, and sanitary.

In November 2016, voters residing within EGUSD overwhelmingly voted to pass Measure M, the District's first ever general obligation school facilities bond measure, which provided funds for upgrades to LED lighting in the gymnasium and/or multi-purpose room at Katherine L. Albiani Middle School.

Recently we were fortunate to have our shade structure installed in our quad, which accommodates many tables for outdoor dining.

Professional Development

KAMS remains dedicated to meeting the needs of every student and eliminating the achievement gap through culturally responsive instruction, developing positive student relationships, and planning lessons that students can relate to their daily life. We focus on formative assessment & feedback in order to improve outcome for our students. Ongoing training with instructional coaches, administration and experienced teachers help to move our school in a positive direction. Early Out Mondays provide staff with an hour each week for Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) to review student work, identify strengths and weaknesses, create common assessments, and develop action plans for improving teacher and student performance. KAMS teachers engage in department release days and vertical articulation with our eight feeder elementary schools and high school.

School Safety Plan

Our district is committed to providing a safe, secure environment for learning. Each Fall staff, students, and parents review and discuss pertinent student discipline and safety data as part of the School Site Council. Recommendations and revisions to the Comprehensive School Safety Plan (CSSP) are submitted to the Board of Education each March. The School Safety Plan was updated with our School Site Council and staff in October 2023. Random, periodic school safety inspections are conducted by the County of Sacramento. The district's Police Services Department works closely with our school site to provide a safe, secure environment for all students. Our campus supervisors and administrative team provide before and after school supervision. Visitors to KAMS are required to check in before entering our campus.

Specialized Programs

Katherine L. Albiani Middle School provides a wide range of specialized programs to meet the individual learning needs of our students. We have a full complement of honors courses and accelerated math classes. Intensive math and English instruction are available to all students performing below proficiency. We also have an Academic Intervention Program to assist students who qualify for special education services. The Achievement Via Individual Determination (AVID) program is offered to students who are interested in developing the skills necessary for college preparatory courses in high school. In addition, our students have a wide variety of enrichment opportunities.
