Teacher Credentials and Misassignments

In the 2024-2025 school year, over 99 percent of the district's teachers held full teaching credentials. In addition to being fully credentialed, if a class is 20 percent or more English Learners (EL), the teacher should hold a supplementary authorization to instruct students in learning English or they are considered misassigned. In subjects with a shortage, a fully credentialed teacher is sometimes asked to teach outside of their subject matter competency area until an appropriately credentialed teacher can be hired. In these cases, teachers are counted as misassigned.

Vacancies are defined as a position to which a permanent teacher has not been assigned by the beginning of the course. Most vacancies in our district are in subject areas where qualified teachers are in shortage.

School Facility Conditions and Planned Improvement

Our school has 36 classrooms, two smaller Learning Center classrooms, a computer lab, a multipurpose room, a library, and an administration building. The campus opened in 1996 and facilities were refreshed in 2023-24.

Our custodial and grounds teams ensure that our campus remains clean and safe. The FIT inspection indicates that all areas of the school are maintained properly.

The principal works with the custodial and grounds teams to develop cleaning schedules. All classrooms, cafeteria and bathrooms are cleaned nightly, regular inspections of bathrooms happen throughout the day.

Our maintenance team regularly maintains our campus.

The district's maintenance and grounds department work in concert with the school's custodial team to ensure that school buildings, classrooms, and grounds are maintained at levels to provide a safe and functional environment for all students. The district utilizes the latest electronic work order system enabling site administration and custodians to communicate maintenance needs, urgent repairs, or necessary projects. Emergency repair needs are immediately resolved by either the school custodian or district maintenance staff. The school custodians work as a team to develop a daily cleaning process and schedule. Each morning the custodian inspects the school prior to students and staff entering school grounds.

In November 2016, voters residing within EGUSD overwhelmingly voted to pass Measure M, the District's first ever general obligation school facilities bond measure. Measure M will provide EGUSD students and the community with \$476 million in critical improvements to existing school buildings and grounds. Maeola R. Beitzel Elementary School's roof renovation has been completed and our classroom/facade renovation will begin on November 20, 2023, and run through September of 2024.

All classrooms were installed with new AV Technology in October/November of 2021.

Professional Development

Our school and district offer a variety of professional learning opportunities for teachers, instructional aides, and non-instructional support staff.

For the 2024-2025 school year, our staff will continue to focus on the implementation of the Illuminate Program, and the California Common Core State Standards in math and English language arts. Moreover, we continued our focus on building effective Professional Learning Communities (PLC). Teachers meet weekly in TK/kindergarten through sixth grades to analyze data, review student progress, and plan instruction based on student data.

Staff collaborates in teams as a professional learning community to focus on teaching and learning. Administration and consult coaches plan professional development for staff based on needs.

Finally, the Elk Grove Unified School District offers a variety of classes for support staff, such as school secretaries, office clerks, and custodians.

School Safety Plan

Our district and school are committed to providing a safe, secure environment for learning. Our staff reviewed and updated our School Safety Plan in September of 2024. Students practice a variety of safety drills monthly and regular positive behavior assemblies are held to remind students and staff of expectations and safe, responsible, and respectful practices. An "Emergency Handbook" outlining a plan of action for emergencies is kept in the school office. Random, periodic school safety inspections are conducted by the County of Sacramento. Visitors are asked to check in and enter the premises through the office, and adult supervision is provided before and after school. The district's Police Services Department works closely with our school site to provide a safe, secure environment for all students.

Specialized Programs

Maeola R. Beitzel Elementary School has highly qualified staff to assist students with special learning needs. Specialized instruction in English Language Development is available to help our English Learners access the core curriculum. English Learners are provided with English Language Development five days per week for 30 minutes while their English-only peers are provided with instruction that meets their individual needs.

Academically talented students in grades 3-6 may participate in our Beitzel GATE Program through GATE funding.

After school enrichment in science, VAPA, and art are offered, some at a nominal fee or at no charge.
