The Elk Grove Charter School is committed to creating individualized educational opportunities for students by combining classroom instruction, independent study instruction, and community and workplace educational experiences. This educational approach is for students who seek an alternative to the traditional classroom-only instructional approach of comprehensive and continuation high school programs.

Elk Grove Charter School supports the district's mission of providing a learning community that challenges all students to realize their greatest potential, through the Expected Schoolwide Learning Results (ESLRs). These expectations are students will become:

Parental support and involvement are important aspect of the success of Elk Grove Charter School and is facilitated through quarterly Advisory Council meetings. These meetings assist Elk Grove Charter School in making critical decisions about instructional goals and the scope of our program.

Parental Involvement

As a public charter school, we are governed by the EGUSD Board of education with input from the school's Advisory Council. Advisory Council Meetings are held quarterly with participation from parents/guardians, staff, students and community members. Parents are welcome to attend weekly Independent Study Program (ISP) meetings and workshop courses to monitor their student's progress. Teacher Credentials and Misassignments

In the 2019-2020 school year, over 99 percent of the district's teachers held full teaching credentials. In addition to being fully credentialed, if a class is 20 percent or more English Learners (EL), the teacher should hold a supplementary authorization to instruct students in learning English or they are considered misassigned.

In subjects with a shortage, a fully credentialed teacher is sometimes asked to teach outside of their subject matter competency area until an appropriately credentialed teacher can be hired. In these cases, teachers are counted as misassigned.

Vacancies are defined as a position to which a permanent teacher has not been assigned by the beginning of the course. Most vacancies in our district are in subject areas where qualified teachers are in shortage.

School Facility Conditions and Planned Improvement

Elk Grove Charter School has one building that was built in 2010. Instruction at this site began in the 2010-11 school year. The building has six direct-instruction classrooms, a teacher work area/kitchen, administrative office, and one large classroom holding 14 individual cubicles for independent study appointments. The direct-instruction classrooms include a computer lab with 24 desktop computers, an art room, science lab, and three generic direct-instruction classrooms.

In addition to the building, the school has a large playing field and two full size basketball courts. There is a sitting area with six picnic tables and a large shade structure that was built in 2013. Other additions to the facility since its original construction include four storage sheds, and security fencing around the perimeter of the school.

The district's maintenance and grounds departments work in concert with the school site custodial team to ensure that school building, classrooms, and grounds are maintained at exceptional levels to provide a safe and functional environment for all students. The district utilizes an electronic work order system enabling site administration and custodians to communicate maintenance needs, urgent repairs, or necessary projects. Emergency repair needs are immediately resolved by either the school custodian or district maintenance staff. The school's custodian work with the site administrator to develop a daily cleaning process and schedule. Each day the custodian inspects the school and makes or reports needed repairs. Restrooms are inspected to ensure they are adequately stocked, safe, and sanitary. A monthly inspection is conducted and forms are submitted to administration. The Board of Education has adopted cleaning standards for all schools in the district. A summary of these standards is available at the school office, or at the district office.

Facilities projects at EGCS are developed through communication with all stakeholders and approved by the school's advisory council. EGCS follows all EGUSD site modification and facilities planning procedures. The school works with district level staff on potential future modifications. Currently, the school is working to expand its facility in order to increase capacity. The school along with district and outside personnel have completed initial facility plans.

Professional Development

A variety of professional learning opportunities exist for teachers, instructional aides, and non-instructional support staff. EGCS conducts weekly staff meeting where teachers receive instruction on a variety of issues and skills to improve their teaching abilities.

New teachers, who have been teaching fewer than two years, are supported by the district's beginning teacher program (BTSA). They meet weekly with an experienced mentor to discuss challenges, successes and new ideas for their classrooms.

The district offers a variety of professional learning opportunities for all staff. Teachers have access to EGUSD professional development and training to support them in their role in the classroom and working with students, families, and colleagues. In addition, school secretaries, office clerks, and custodians may take classes that relate to their work such as learning new computer skills and learning to work more efficiently and in ergonomically correct ways. All staff members have access to outward mindset training

School Safety Plan

A safe campus is crucial to effective learning. The safe school planning committee annually reviews and updates the Comprehensive School Safety Plan. The annual review of the plan occurred in December 2021 and was approved by the school's advisory council in January 2022. EGCS has an alternate schedule and therefore "before and after school" may be defined differently for each student. EGCS supervises a variety of support workshops and labs during the school day; parents commit to arrange timely transportation before/after school. Access to the school by members of the public is controlled by fencing and gates that are either locked or monitored by EGCS staff. Visitors must be approved by administration, sign in and wear a visible visitor pass while on campus.

Specialized Programs

Elk Grove Charter School uses a combination of independent study and workshop classes to assist students in increasing their learning. Specifically, 7th-10th grade students attend English, Math, Science, and Social Science direct-instruction workshops. Under the direction of an Independent Study Teacher (ISP), students complete the remaining curriculum independently. Eleventh and twelfth grade students primarily learn independently, while working with the support and guidance of an ISP teacher. In addition, these students have the opportunity to attend support workshops to assist them in completing the required curriculum for graduation.

Elk Grove Charter offers students the ability to earn an EGUSD approved high school diploma by completing either traditional or alternative graduation requirements. At the beginning of each semester, the ISP teacher, student, and parent/guardian discuss Pre and Post graduation goals and create a semester course plan.
