Teacher Credentials and Misassignments

In the 2024-2025 school year, over 99 percent of the district's teachers held full teaching credentials. In addition to being fully credentialed, if a class is 20 percent or more English Learners (EL), the teacher should hold a supplementary authorization to instruct students in learning English or they are considered misassigned. In subjects with a shortage, a fully credentialed teacher is sometimes asked to teach outside of their subject matter competency area until an appropriately credentialed teacher can be hired. In these cases, teachers are counted as misassigned.

Vacancies are defined as a position to which a permanent teacher has not been assigned by the beginning of the course. Most vacancies in our district are in subject areas where qualified teachers are in shortage.

School Facility Conditions and Planned Improvement

Elk Grove Elementary School has 32 classrooms, one learning center room, a multipurpose room, a library, computer room, and an administration building. The main campus was built in 1992.

Our school is beautifully landscaped and enjoys a well-designed playground, field and track. An additional play structure was installed in the spring of 2020. Four outdoor tables and benches are located under mature shade trees offering outdoor learning experiences for many of our kids.

We recently added a new shade structure on our playground, new murals in the multi-purpose room, and a water filling station! The site will undergo a refresh to update flooring, paint, and other improvements during the summer of 2025.

The district's maintenance and grounds departments work in concert with our school site custodial team to ensure that school buildings, classrooms, and grounds are maintained at exceptional levels to provide a safe and functional environment for all students.

The school's custodians work as a team and with the principal to develop a daily cleaning process and schedule. Each morning the custodian inspects the school prior to students and staff entering school grounds. Restrooms are inspected throughout the day to ensure that they are adequately stocked, safe, and sanitary. The Board of Education has adopted cleaning standards for all schools in the district. A summary of these standards is available at the school office, or at the district office.

We now have a new shade structure on our playground along with a water filling station. We have a new bench area that was built in our quad, and teachers are receiving updated projectors for their classrooms.

Our school will undergo a refresh during the summer of 2025.

Professional Development

Our school and district offer a variety of professional learning opportunities for teachers, para-educators, and non-instructional support staff.

Professional Learning Communities (PLC's) are in place at every grade level focusing on enhancing the instructional program and the ongoing improvement of academic achievement. Our staff development days include AVID, PBIS, Culturally Responsive Teaching, along with the Framework of High-Quality Teaching.

School Safety Plan

The safety of your child, visitors, and the staff at Elk Grove Elementary is our first priority. Our students require a safe, orderly, secure and comfortable environment in which to learn. Each classroom has emergency procedures posted. Monthly fire, disaster, earthquake, and intruder drills are held. Gates are kept closed and locked. Access is controlled during the day and adult supervision is provided before and after school.

Visitors must check in at the office. The district's Police Services Department also works closely with our school site and is available to assist in providing a safe, secure environment for all students.

The School Safety Plan is updated annually. The School Safety Plan was last revised in August 2024

Specialized Programs

At Elk Grove Elementary highly qualified staff are assigned to assist students with special learning needs. Our Learning Center provides support for students who have identified educational programs.

Elk Grove Elementary School offers after school team sports, band, and a Runnin' for Rhett program.

Programs for G.A.T.E. have been fully implemented during the 2024-2025 school year. Our English Language Learners (ELL) students receive daily language development support within the classroom.

Summer school is usually provided each year. Summer school is well attended and focuses on remedial and enrichment opportunities for students in grades first through sixth as well as social emotional learning for all.
