Teacher Credentials and Misassignments

In the 2024-2025 school year, over 99 percent of the district's teachers held full teaching credentials. In addition to being fully credentialed, if a class is 20 percent or more English Learners (EL), the teacher should hold a supplementary authorization to instruct students in learning English or they are considered misassigned. In subjects with a shortage, a fully credentialed teacher is sometimes asked to teach outside of their subject matter competency area until an appropriately credentialed teacher can be hired. In these cases, teachers are counted as misassigned.

Vacancies are defined as a position to which a permanent teacher has not been assigned by the beginning of the course. Most vacancies in our district are in subject areas where qualified teachers are in shortage.

School Facility Conditions and Planned Improvement

The campus was built in 2002 and has 47 classrooms, eight classroom pods, a multipurpose room with a stage, band room, kitchen classroom, TV production classroom, specialized science wing, two computer labs, and a gym that contains a dance room. The school has extensive fields for physical education including a running track, basketball courts, and a football field. TJMS is on the same property as Franklin High School, separated by fences and the Franklin Community Library, which is the largest in the city serving both schools as well as the local community.

The district's maintenance and grounds departments work with the school site custodial team to ensure that school buildings, classrooms, and grounds are maintained. The district utilizes an electronic work order system enabling site administration and custodians to communicate maintenance needs, urgent repairs, or necessary projects. Emergency repair needs are immediately resolved by either the school custodian or district maintenance staff. The school's custodians work as a team and with the principal to develop a daily cleaning process and schedule. Each morning, prior to the arrival of staff and students, the custodian inspects the school and the site is cleaned each evening. Restrooms are inspected throughout the day to ensure that they are adequately stocked, safe, and sanitary.

During 2024, facilities improvements included: adding a Scrim at the back of the indoor stage to enhance possible displays projected during theater productions, replacing the sound system in the gym, and repairing the scoreboard in the gym. Site mod requests have been submitted for potential future work, to include; multiple faucets added to the art room sink, replacing the Dance Room floor, replacing the indoor stage floor, adding cement stairs to the outdoor stage to replace the large raised bed, and adding privacy dividers between urinals in the boys' restrooms.

Professional Development

Our school and district offer a variety of professional learning opportunities for teachers, instructional aides, and non-instructional support staff. Teachers take part in professional development programs to increase students' conceptual understanding of mathematics, science, reading, and writing. Our teachers are dedicated to providing the enhanced strategies available through state adopted standards. Special Education teachers and EL teachers have additional opportunities to learn how to best support students with special learning needs.

Our school has a weekly late start schedule so departments and teams can meet and coordinate curriculum and instruction. Teachers meet to review student work, make determinations about students' strengths and weaknesses, and plan subsequent instruction to meet students' needs.

Paraeducators, school secretaries, office clerks, security, and custodians take classes that relate to their work such as learning new computer skills, and learning to work more efficiently and in ergonomically correct ways.

All teachers have the opportunity for two PLC release days for aligning curriculum and all staff take EGUSD courses in Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion.

School Safety Plan

School safety is the highest priority at Toby Johnson Middle School. Our School Site Council reviewed our School Safety Plan in September, 2024. Included in the plan are monitoring practices that not only address student safety during school hours, but before and after school as well. Gates are monitored while open at school start and dismissal and locked during the school day. All visitors sign in when entering our campus and wear identification.

An "Emergency Handbook," outlining a plan of action for emergencies such as earthquakes, fires, floods, and chemical spills, is kept in the school office as well as each classroom. The district's Police Services Department works closely with us to provide a secure environment for all students.

Specialized Programs

All students have access to our Honors program and all students have the opportunity to test and qualify for GATE (Gifted and Talented). Through extended day instruction, targeted interventions are provided and available after school. Our Electives Department offers unique Yearbook and TJTV (Broadcast Journalism) programs which provide opportunities for students to exercise creativity and enhance technological skills in newscasting, and graphic design and layout. Our CTE (Career Technical Education) courses prepare students for a variety of high school pathways. In addition to a robust elective program, the school offers more than 30 clubs and after school programs which include Theater, Computer Science, Art, Cyber-Patriots, and Music. Our award-winning marching band competes in high school competitions, and our programs have been aligned with Franklin High School.
