Parental Involvement

Teacher Credentials and Misassignments

In the 2024-2025 school year, over 99 percent of the district's teachers held full teaching credentials. In addition to being fully credentialed, if a class is 20 percent or more English Learners (EL), the teacher should hold a supplementary authorization to instruct students in learning English or they are considered misassigned.

In subjects with a shortage, a fully credentialed teacher is sometimes asked to teach outside of their subject matter competency area until an appropriately credentialed teacher can be hired. In these cases, teachers are counted as misassigned.

Vacancies are defined as a position to which a permanent teacher has not been assigned by the beginning of the course. Most vacancies in our district are in subject areas where qualified teachers are in shortage.

School Facility Conditions and Planned Improvement

Joseph Kerr Middle School has 51 classrooms, a Multipurpose Room, a Gymnasium, a Library, a Band Room, Woodshop, Computer Labs, and an Administration Building. The main campus was built in 1964 and is recognized as the first middle school in Elk Grove Unified School District.

The district utilizes the latest electronic work order system enabling site administration and custodians to communicate maintenance needs and projects. Emergency repair needs are immediately resolved by either the school custodian or district maintenance staff. Each morning the custodian inspects the school prior to students and staff entering school grounds. Restrooms are inspected throughout the day to ensure that they are adequately stocked, safe, and sanitary. A summary of The Board of Education adopted cleaning standards is available at the school office, or at the district office.

In 2020 we had new energy efficient lighting installed school-wide, new HVAC on designated buildings, and new roofs. Hospital grade air filters were added to all buildings to enhance COVID-19 Safety protocols. Construction was recently completed for a new state of the art Gymnasium and Science Building. In addition, new touch-based projectors were installed in the English and History classrooms. Finally, in 2024 we are completely demolishing and re-building our Math Building, Special Education building, Woodshop, and Computer classroom, with an expected completion date of December of 2026.

Professional Development

Our school and district offer a variety of professional learning opportunities for teachers, paraeducators, and non-instructional support staff. Our school has a weekly early dismissal schedule so departments and grade level teams can meet and coordinate curriculum and instruction. Teachers meet to review student work, make determinations about students' strengths and weaknesses, develop and implement appropriate assessments and plan subsequent instruction to meet students' needs. Teachers take part in Math and Science professional development programs intended to increase students' conceptual understanding of mathematics and science. Our school community fully participates as a Professional Learning Community to increase student learning. Special education teachers have numerous opportunities to learn how to best meet the needs of students with learning disabilities. Paraeducators, school secretaries, office technicians and custodians take classes that relate to their work such as learning new computer skills and learning to work more efficiently and in ergonomically correct ways. Moreover, Teachers participate in professional development opportunities put on by EGUSD District Coaches throughout the year that focuses on the specific needs of students attending Joseph Kerr Middle School.

School Safety Plan

Your child's safety is important to us. Supervision is provided by campus security, teachers and administrators before and after school. Controlled access to our campus is through the Main Office and visitors are required to present ID, check-in, and wear appropriate identification. Our staff reviewed and updated our School Safety Plan in February of 2024. An "Emergency Handbook," outlining a plan of action for emergencies such as earthquakes, fires, floods, and chemical spills, is kept in the school office. The district's Police Services Department works closely with our school site to provide a safe, secure environment for all students. Joseph Kerr Middle School conducts regularly scheduled fire, earthquake and/or lockdown drills in order to prepare students and staff for emergency procedures.

Specialized Programs

At Joseph Kerr Middle School, we have highly qualified staff to assist students with special learning needs. We provide a range of support for students with disabilities as well as general education students who need additional support to meet the common core standards.

We offer EL English classes to support students in improving their English language acquisition.

Gifted and Talented students participate in accelerated instruction in honors classes in addition to specific GATE activities.

Tutoring is available before, during and after school. Students have access to computers in the Library throughout the school day for additional support.

Elective courses include Jazz Band, Band 1, Band 2, Woodshop, Art I/Art II, Exploring Science, Future Quest, Digital Media, AVID, Leadership, and Yearbook.
