Our staff, students and families have lived and embraced this mission and as a result, our students are experiencing academic and social emotional growth. This year's school theme is: Today's Readers. Tomorrow's Leaders.

Our staff works hard every year to help students fill in academic gaps and bolster learning. We have made small group instruction a priority as well as supporting our multi-lingual students and newcomers. In addition, there is a strong focus on addressing the social emotional needs of students and teachers through classroom activities, an increase in wellness providers, class discussions, the Second Step Program, reading, and individual projects. Teachers are making learning meaningful and purposeful while attending to the thoughts, feelings, and personal expressions of their students. Because of these efforts, we have vastly reduced the number of disciplinary occurrences as we focus on the whole child and restorative practices.

Parent university events at Charles Mack teach modeled strategies that can be used by parents at home. In combination with our expanding list of family-teacher run activities, the Charles Mack community continues to strengthen the existing parent-teacher bond while promoting family and togetherness. In addition, our Champions after school program provides all Charles Mack students with access to a menu of athletic, academic, and musical enrichment opportunities.

Parental Involvement

Teacher Credentials and Misassignments

In the 2024-2025 school year, over 99 percent of the district's teachers held full teaching credentials. In addition to being fully credentialed, if a class is 20 percent or more English Learners (EL), the teacher should hold a supplementary authorization to instruct students in learning English or they are considered misassigned. In subjects with a shortage, a fully credentialed teacher is sometimes asked to teach outside of their subject matter competency area until an appropriately credentialed teacher can be hired. In these cases, teachers are counted as misassigned.

Vacancies are defined as a position to which a permanent teacher has not been assigned by the beginning of the course. Most vacancies in our district are in subject areas where qualified teachers are in shortage.

School Facility Conditions and Planned Improvement

Charles Mack Elementary's main campus was originally built in 1965. Our school currently has 35 classrooms, a multipurpose room, a library, a computer lab and an administration building. Additions were constructed in 1968 and 1972. The current multipurpose room was built in 1990, and in 2000, additional permanent classrooms were added. In 2014, a walkway, fencing, increased drainage and new sod were done, and an initial remodel for the parking lot has been completed. In 2017, a new, extended parking lot replaced the old one. In 2021, cameras were added for campus monitoring. In the summer of 2022, permanent buildings received new roofs and all classrooms were upgraded. In the summer 2023, a new playground was created. New HVAC systems were recently installed in the office building.

The district's Maintenance and Grounds departments work in concert with the school site custodial team to ensure that school buildings, classrooms, and grounds are maintained at exceptional levels. The district utilizes the latest electronic work order system enabling site administration and custodians to communicate maintenance needs, urgent repairs, or necessary projects and emergency repair needs are immediately resolved. School's custodians work as a team and with the administrators to develop a daily cleaning process and schedule. Each morning the custodian inspects the school prior to students and staff entering school grounds. Restrooms are inspected throughout the day for safety and sanitation. The Board of Education has adopted cleaning standards for all schools

Thanks to the district's governing board, the Facilities and Planning department, and the support of the Charles Mack community, modernization projects have been done inside and outside our buildings. The HVAC system in the A wing was replaced in the of summer 2024. Both the Kinder and main playgrounds were refreshed all in the summer and fall of 2024. There are also plans to upgrade the HVAC systems for the rest of the campus in the summer of 2025.

For the 2024 - 2025 school year, class sizes are 24 to 1 in Transitional Kindergarten through 3rd grade, and 28 to 1 in 4th through 6th grades.

Professional Development

Charles Mack teachers have either been trained or will be trained in how to use Guided Language Acquisition and Design (GLAD), Guided Reading, and close reading strategies to help Mack students develop skills and access information across contents. This year, our teachers have increased their use of social-emotional learning activities through the school-wide implementation of the Second Step Program. Our district has adopted Illuminate to provide common assessments which are used to inform instruction and guide lesson planning. Each staff member is also required to complete courses with the EPOCH Education program including Understanding the Power of Language Acquisition and Communicating and Partnering with All Families. The teaching staff has also been provided training for our new math program: Envision as well as sessions for effective small group instruction. Our district continues to provide professional development in a variety of areas of need and concern to our staff. At Mack, staff professional development is relevant and timely planned in an effort to meet the changing needs of our staff.

School Safety Plan

The School Site Council reviewed and approved the Comprehensive School Safety Plan on September 27, 2024, to include documentation of new safety precautions including a new Kinder gate and an office buzzer door system, and improved suspension data. From 7:30 when breakfast starts to 5:30 when our Champions after school program ends, students who are on campus are safe from harm and well supervised. Access to the school is controlled through locked gates at entry points around the school, and visitors are required to sign in at the office upon arrival and get either a visitor sticker or lanyard to wear while they are on campus. We are a closed campus from 8:10am to dismissal. Our Emergency Response Procedures are available in every classroom, and students have numerous opportunities to practice them through various preparatory and practice drills throughout the year.

Specialized Programs

Mack provides numerous programs and supports for students. Our workshop intervention model provides daily small group instruction student based on identified needs. Support from highly qualified AITs (Academic Intervention Teachers), dedicated paraeducators, strong ELD and CCSS coaches, and committed special education teachers also provide students with solid specialized instruction. To address social and emotional needs, Mack teachers have integrated the 2nd Step curriculum, and our psychological, counseling, and mental health services are available to address diagnosed needs. New this year is the Bounce Back Program. Mack's PBIS Tier 1 and Tier 2 programs are strong and include a calming room on campus, school staff and district student mentoring, and boosting attendance. Lastly, Champions provides athletic and academic enrichment and music, as pillars of our after school program.
