### Parental Involvement

### **Teacher Credentials and Misassignments**

In the 2024-2025 school year, over 99 percent of the district's teachers held full teaching credentials. In addition to being fully credentialed, if a class is 20 percent or more English Learners (EL), the teacher should hold a supplementary authorization to instruct students in learning English or they are considered misassigned. In subjects with a shortage, a fully credentialed teacher is sometimes asked to teach outside of their subject matter competency area until an appropriately credentialed teacher can be hired. In these cases, teachers are counted as misassigned.

Vacancies are defined as a position to which a permanent teacher has not been assigned by the beginning of the course. Most vacancies in our district are in subject areas where qualified teachers are in shortage.

### School Facility Conditions and Planned Improvement

Miwok Village Elementary, opened in July 2022, features 34 classrooms, a computer lab, tinker room, library, multipurpose room, and an administration building to support preschool through sixth grade students. Our outdoor spaces include playgrounds for preschool to first grade, a track, amphitheater, covered eating patio, basketball courts, GAGA ball pit, tetherball, and 4-square courts. The campus also includes a fenced bike rack, two pedestrian crosswalks, and staff supervision before and after school. Catalyst offers fee-based afterschool care in a portable within secure fencing. A beautiful nature walking path with indigenous California plants provides a peaceful outdoor learning space for students and staff.

The district's Maintenance and Operations Department collaborates with the site custodial team to maintain our school buildings, classrooms, and grounds to exceptional standards, ensuring a safe and functional environment for all students. Emergency repairs are promptly addressed by the custodian or district maintenance staff. Our custodians work together to establish a daily cleaning process and schedule. The site custodian inspects the school grounds before students and staff arrive. Restrooms are regularly checked throughout the day to ensure they are stocked, safe, and sanitary. A summary of these standards is available at the school office or district office.

### **Professional Development**

Professional development opportunities are provided by the district, region, and site to support teachers, paraeducators, and non-instructional support staff. Teachers engage in district-led training focused on reading, math, technology, and science to enhance students' conceptual understanding. Special education teachers have numerous opportunities to improve strategies for meeting the needs of students with learning disabilities.

New teachers (with fewer than two years of experience) are supported by the district's beginning teacher program, which pairs them with experienced mentors for regular meetings to discuss successes, challenges, and new ideas for their classrooms.

Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) meet regularly at each grade level to analyze data, collaborate, and address student needs. In addition, staff receive training to support English Language Learners, students with disabilities, and Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS).

Paraeducators, school secretaries, office assistants, and custodians can take classes related to their roles, such as computer skills, workplace efficiency, and ergonomic practices. Support staff also receive training in CPR, first aid, behavior management, safety procedures, and mandated reporting.

Additionally, professional learning opportunities are provided to support diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) as well as ongoing efforts in social-emotional learning.

### School Safety Plan

Our school is strongly committed to providing a safe and secure learning environment. School rules are enforced by all staff, and our School Safety Plan was reviewed and updated in September 2024. An 'Emergency Handbook' outlining a plan of action for disasters such as earthquakes, fires, floods, and chemical spills is kept in the school office and in every classroom. Each classroom has an Emergency Procedures folder for the teacher's use.

We schedule routine emergency drills, and random, periodic school safety inspections are conducted by the County of Sacramento. The district's Safety and Security Department is readily available to support the school in any emergency or safety-related need.

Supervision of students is provided 10 minutes before and after school hours. We have a closed campus, and all visitors must sign in through the office during school hours.

### **Specialized Programs**

At Miwok Village Elementary, our dedicated and highly qualified staff supports students with special learning needs. English Learners develop language skills and access the core curriculum through daily English Language Development (ELD) and What I Need (WIN) programs, along with small group interventions. GATE and accelerated students are engaged and challenged through differentiated instruction. The MVES Learning Center offers specialized instruction to Special Education students based on their individual learning goals. Our Academic Intervention Teachers support students in grades K-6 to ensure progress toward grade-level standards. Students also have the opportunity to participate in a variety of extracurricular activities throughout the school year.
