Parental Involvement

Teacher Credentials and Misassignments

In the 2021-2022 school year, over 99 percent of the district's teachers held full teaching credentials. In addition to being fully credentialed, if a class is 20 percent or more English Learners (EL), the teacher should hold a supplementary authorization to instruct students in learning English or they are considered misassigned. In subjects with a shortage, a fully credentialed teacher is sometimes asked to teach outside of their subject matter competency area until an appropriately credentialed teacher can be hired. In these cases, teachers are counted as misassigned. Vacancies are defined as a position to which a permanent teacher has not been assigned by the beginning of the course. Most vacancies in our district are in subject areas where qualified teachers are in shortage.

School Facility Conditions and Planned Improvement

Marion Mix has a main building containing 27 classrooms, library, computer lab, and an administrative office. Additionally, a separate Kindergarten building contains a teacher workroom and three classrooms as well as a freestanding Multipurpose Room. Also located on our site, is a designated area for Champions that provides before and after school care for the convenience of our families.

The main campus was completed in the spring of 2015 and opened its doors to students on August 13, 2015. As one of the newer Elk Grove Unified School District schools and one of only three two-story schools in the district, Mix is equipped with current technology, and energy efficiency as a priority. In 2018, and as a result of the passage of Measure M, Marion Mix received a large shade structure in the fall of 2019. During the 2017-2018 school year, SMUD also provided shade trees for our field. As a result of the incorporation of energy saving technologies, Marion Mix has been recognized through SMUD for our sustainability.

The district ensures that all schools are clean, safe, and functional. To assist in this effort, the district uses a facility survey instrument developed by the State of California Office of Public School Construction. Each month, the lead custodian, in collaboration with the site administrator, conducts a thorough inspection of the school grounds utilizing this survey instrument. On a daily basis the custodial team provides supervision and maintenance from 6:30 am - 10:00 pm. During these hours the school facilities are thoroughly cleaned, the classrooms are inspected, the playground is maintained and the restrooms are checked hourly. District maintenance staff ensures that the repairs necessary to keep the school in good repair and working order are completed in a timely manner. A work order process is used to ensure efficient service and that emergency repairs are given the highest priority. The district governing board has adopted cleaning standards for all schools in the district. A summary of these standards is available at the school office or the district Facilities Department. The principal works with the custodial staff to develop cleaning schedules to ensure a clean and safe school.

For the 2022 - 2023 school year, class sizes are 24 to 1 in Transitional Kindergarten through 3rd grade, and 28 to 1 in 4th through 6th grades.

Professional Development

Our school and District offer a variety of professional learning opportunities for all staff. Currently, our school is focusing on the implementation of research-based, high quality instructional practices through Visible Learning strategies. The staff has also been trained on Project Lead the Way which is a project-based science curriculum, that is being implemented to best support our emphasis on STEM instruction. We continue with our implementation of Professional Learning Communities, in which our teachers focus on collaboration and student learning. Our staff is also committed to learning strategies to support Social Emotional Learning as well as Culturally Responsive Teaching practices. This year our 5th and 6th grade teachers were trained in AVID and are implementing AVID strategies in their classes. Teachers who have been teaching fewer than two years are supported by the district's Beginning Teacher Program. They meet weekly with an experienced mentor to work on specific strategies to meet the needs of all students in their classrooms.

School Safety Plan

At Mix, we believe that nothing should impede the academic achievement of our students, and our district is committed to providing a safe and secure environment for learning. Our safety handbook outlines procedures for emergencies such as earthquakes, fires, lock down situations and floods for prompt and effective response. School wide drills for these protocols are practiced regularly. The District's Police Services collaborates with our site in maintaining safety at our school and throughout our community. A review of our school safety plan is conducted yearly in February 2023 and approved by our School Site Council. We provide staff supervision before and after school, and all visitors are required to sign-in at the front office and wear badges while on campus. During school hours, all gates are kept locked to limit accessibility.

Specialized Programs

At Marion Mix, we have highly qualified staff to assist students with special learning needs. Our Learning Center provides services for special education students. We also have two ABSS Academic, Behavior, and Social Supports self-contained classes. All English Language Learners participate in direct English instruction through our designated ELD time. The needs of Gifted and Talented students are met within the classroom by providing enrichment experiences and/or after school in various ways. Our CREST (Capital Region Engineering Science Technology) and Robotics programs meet after school weekly to encourage students to learn more about engineering and robotics. In addition, we have expanded our VAPA opportunities with a performing choir, band, yearbook design and art club. Continuing this year, is the National Elementary Honor Society which meets bi-monthly and focuses on community service. We also provide various sports opportunities such as Basketball, Volleyball and Running for Rhett. Our sixth grade students have the opportunity to join student leadership where they support our school events, and all of our sixth grade students have the opportunity to attend Redwood Alliance camp for four days.
