Parental Involvement

Teacher Credentials and Misassignments

In the 2024-2025 school year, over 99 percent of the district's teachers held full teaching credentials. In addition to being fully credentialed, if a class is 20 percent or more English Learners (EL), the teacher should hold a supplementary authorization to instruct students in learning English or they are considered misassigned. In subjects with a shortage, a fully credentialed teacher is sometimes asked to teach outside of their subject matter competency area until an appropriately credentialed teacher can be hired. In these cases, teachers are counted as misassigned.

Vacancies are defined as a position to which a permanent teacher has not been assigned by the beginning of the course. Most vacancies in our district are in subject areas where qualified teachers are in shortage.

School Facility Conditions and Planned Improvement

Pleasant Grove Elementary School has 20 classrooms, a multipurpose room, a library, and an administration building. The original main campus at this site was originally built in 1951 and retrofitted in 1993. However, the campus went through modernization July 2020-January 2023, during which many buildings were torn down and new buildings were completed in their place. There is a large playground and field area with a track that affords students ample space for recesses and PE activities. There is wireless technology in place so that the teachers and students have full access to technology. There are Interactive Boards in every classroom.

The district's maintenance and grounds departments work with the site custodial team to ensure school buildings, classrooms, and grounds are maintained at exceptional levels to provide a safe functional environment for all students. The district's electronic work order system enables sites to communicate maintenance needs. Emergency repair needs are immediately resolved by the school custodian or district maintenance. The custodians work as a team to develop a daily cleaning process and schedule. Each morning the custodian inspects the school prior to students and staff entering school grounds. Restrooms are inspected throughout the day to ensure that they are adequately stocked, safe, and sanitary. The Board of Education has adopted cleaning standards for all schools in the district.

Pleasant Grove Elementary went through modernization July 2020-January 2023. The multi-purpose room will be modernized in the near future.

Professional Development

Our school and district offer a variety of professional learning opportunities for teachers, instructional aides, and support staff. As a site, we are currently focusing on development of Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) with a focus on Common Core State Standards in ELA and Math. Our focus is on Engagement Strategies, Collaborative Conversations, and using technology to support ELA and Math standards. In addition, we provide opportunities for our students to familiarize themselves with taking assessments via the computer since this is how they will be assessed on State Assessments again this year. During on-going grade level meetings and Early-Out Thursdays, teachers meet and review student work, make determinations about students' strengths and weaknesses, and plan subsequent instruction to meet students' needs. The on-going collaboration between teachers and grade levels has been a strength for our site and academic program.

School Safety Plan

Your child's safety is important to us at Pleasant Grove Elementary. Our staff reviewed and updated our School Safety Plan in October 2024. An Emergency Handbook, outlining a plan of action for emergencies such as earthquakes, fires, floods, and chemical spills, is kept in every classroom, office, and our main school office. Random, periodic school safety inspections are conducted by the County of Sacramento. The district's Safety & Security Department works closely with our school site to provide a safe, secure environment for all students. We are a locked campus and visitors sign in and out through the main office. Students have supervision before school beginning at 7:50 for those who eat breakfast at school and at 8:05 for those dropped off when the gate opens. Students are supervised after school at dismissal until they are picked up by a parent or guardian.

Specialized Programs

At our school we have highly qualified staff to assist students with special learning needs. Our Learning Center services special education students who need additional support to meet the standards. English Language Development instruction through our ELA curriculum program and academic tutors help our English Learners access the core curriculum. Gifted and Talented students are exposed to a high interest, after school class with hands on activities. Students who need extra tutoring or homework help can participate in a before or after school tutoring program with our teaching staff.
