Parental Involvement

Teacher Credentials and Misassignments

In the 2022-2023 school year, over 99 percent of the district's teachers held full teaching credentials. In addition to being fully credentialed, if a class is 20 percent or more English Learners (EL), the teacher should hold a supplementary authorization to instruct students in learning English or they are considered misassigned. In subjects with a shortage, a fully credentialed teacher is sometimes asked to teach outside of their subject matter competency area until an appropriately credentialed teacher can be hired. In these cases, teachers are counted as misassigned.

Vacancies are defined as a position to which a permanent teacher has not been assigned by the beginning of the course. Most vacancies in our district are in subject areas where qualified teachers are in shortage.

School Facility Conditions and Planned Improvement

Prairie opened its doors in 1981. The school has 45 classrooms, a multipurpose room, a library, a computer lab, and an administration building. The campus also includes a County Office of Education Annex, Student Support Center Office, Pre-school and CDI portables. The modernization begun in 2005 consisted of new wings (G, H, I, K-3, new blacktop, new playfield and irrigation system) and was completed September 2006. In July of 2018, Prairie was updated with new flooring in the Multipurpose Room. A new shade structure was installed on our playground in 2020. All classrooms received updated Audio Visual technology for supporting daily instruction. In 2022, Prairie received a refresh which included new carpet, new painting and new lighting in all buildings on campus.

Prairie Elementary School has four full time custodians who ensure the cleanliness of the school campus daily from 6:00 am to 10:30 pm. Our restrooms are cleaned multiple times throughout the day with deep cleaning occurring every evening. Our multi-purpose room is cleaned after each meal and used by both school and outside groups.

The school grounds are regularly maintained by the district's grounds team, which serves Prairie Elementary every other week. The lead custodian walks the campus every morning to look for any contraband or safety issues that might have arisen overnight to ensure student safety. Any repair concerns are reported to the district's maintenance and facilities team. The district's maintenance and facilities team regularly addresses Prairie's work orders.

A new roof was installed on the multi-purpose room and the library building in 2019. A new Marquee was installed in 2016. Our Multi-Purpose room had new flooring installed in 2019. A new shade structure was installed on the playground in 2020. All classrooms have been updated with new Audio Visual technology for instructional use. Prairie completed a refresh project in 2022 which included new carpet, new painting and new lighting in all buildings on campus.

Professional Development

Our school and district offer a variety of professional learning opportunities for teachers, paraprofessionals, and non-instructional support staff. Our focus is on closing the achievement gap by formulating professional development opportunities based on proven research. Teachers meet weekly on Early Out Wednesdays as Professional Learning Communities.

Professional Development opportunities include: Diversity, Equity and Inclusion, Instructional Framework, reading fluency, strategies that meet the needs of English Language Learners, data analysis, cultural diversity, implementing the English Language Development Curriculum, Special Education, differentiated instruction, technology training, Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports, math and comprehension strategies.

New teachers who have been teaching fewer than two years are supported by the district's beginning teacher program. They meet weekly with an experienced mentor to discuss their successes and challenges and new ideas for their classrooms.

Finally, the district offers a variety of classes for support staff, Paraprofessionals, school secretaries, office clerks, and custodians related to their work such as learning new computer skills and learning to work more efficiently and in ergonomically correct ways.

School Safety Plan

Our School Safety Plan was updated and reviewed with our staff in January of 2023. Our gates open at 7:30 a.m. for breakfast and are secured by 8:10 a.m. All visitors must enter our campus through the front office and receive a visitor's pass. Our gates open at 10:30 for our kindergarten parents and students to enter and are secured again at 10:40 a.m. Our after school program secures the campus at 2:45 p.m. to provide for the safety of the students remaining, and does not open the gates again until 5:30 p.m. All visitors after school also check in through the front office to proceed to the campus. Students are supervised by staff both before and after school. Safety drills are conducted monthly. Our Positive Behavior Intervention Support team meets monthly and reviews any necessary adjustments to the School Safety Plan.

Specialized Programs

Our Learning Center services special education students who need additional support to meet IEP goals. Intervention teachers service small groups of students in every classroom four days a week. We provide one hour of "What I Need" time for English learners to receive additional instruction. English speakers receive additional help in areas of need. Gifted and Talented students participate in accelerated instruction within their classrooms and in afterschool classes including CREST. Students who participate in our afterschool program, Fast Track, benefit from homework support and enrichment opportunities. Enrichment classes include flag football, basketball, volleyball, soccer, track, dance, band and gardening. In addition, we offer off-track intersession taught by credentialed teachers.
