A Message From the Principal

T. R. Smedberg Middle School serves 7th and 8th grade students in the Sheldon High School region of the Elk Grove Unified School District. We are the home of The Wolverines and our diverse student population receives a wide variety of learning experiences that will prepare them for success in high school and beyond. We recognize that not all students are in the same place with their academic skills. Students who demonstrate a need for additional support are enrolled in intervention classes and receive additional help through after-school programs. Students who demonstrate skills "above the norm" have opportunities to continue to excel in honors classes, our GATE program and academic competition teams such as Science Olympiad and Mathletes. With Sheldon High school "next door," Smedberg students can participate in the high school orchestra or take a variety of World Language classes including Spanish and Japanese. Additionally, Smedberg provides a vibrant Visual and Performing Arts (VAPA) program through our fully staffed dance, theater, or music programs. Our arts program includes beginning and intermediate learning opportunities. Students learn Career Technical Education (CTE) skills in our fully equipped Woodshop, Future Quest and Computer classes. To further develop the whole student, Smedberg has incorporated time into the regular school schedule for clubs to meet on campus once a week. Students participate in a wide variety of clubs, including: Black Student Union, Ukulele, The Asian/Pacific Islanders, Dumbledore's Army, Chess, or over 20 other clubs that are sponsored by Smedberg teachers.

Teacher Credentials and Misassignments

In the 2024-2025 school year, over 99 percent of the district's teachers held full teaching credentials. In addition to being fully credentialed, if a class is 20 percent or more English Learners (EL), the teacher should hold a supplementary authorization to instruct students in learning English or they are considered misassigned. In subjects with a shortage, a fully credentialed teacher is sometimes asked to teach outside of their subject matter competency area until an appropriately credentialed teacher can be hired. In these cases, teachers are counted as misassigned.

Vacancies are defined as a position to which a permanent teacher has not been assigned by the beginning of the course. Most vacancies in our district are in subject areas where qualified teachers are in shortage.

School Facility Conditions and Planned Improvement

T. R. Smedberg opened in 1997. The facility includes 42 classrooms, a fully functional, state of the art, woodshop, a dance studio, a band/choir room, a multipurpose room, a main and auxiliary gym, a library, and an administration building. There is a staff lounge attached to the Multipurpose Room/Cafeteria as well as a staff office space in room E-11. We are able to provide individual office space for our Speech Therapist and Social Worker.

Smedberg's custodial team works with the district's Maintenance and Grounds departments to ensure that our school site is maintained a safe and functional environment for all students. The district utilizes a work order system, enabling the lead custodian to communicate maintenance needs and urgent repairs. Emergency repairs are immediately resolved by either the school staff or district maintenance staff. The school's custodians work collaboratively to develop a daily cleaning process and schedule. Restrooms are inspected throughout the day to ensure they are adequately stocked, safe, and sanitary. The Board of Education has adopted cleaning standards for all schools in the district. A summary of these standards is available at the school office, or at the district office.

Professional Development

Smedberg teachers receive on-going training in strategic instructional practices, understanding of the Common Core curriculum and how to effectively support the social and emotional wellbeing of students. Additionally, teachers continue to be trained in strategies that engage students in the critical thinking and knowledge application skills required by the Common Core. In addition, the staff has received training in instructional strategies to meet the needs of English Language Learning students and students with IEP's/504's. The district also offers a variety of professional growth opportunities around diversity, equity and inclusion. Instructional aides, school secretaries, office clerks, and custodians may take classes and receive training in job skills and techniques that will make them more effective and efficient in their work.

School Safety Plan

The safety of our students is a top priority for us. We know that when students feel safe, they are free to focus on learning. Expectations for student behavior are clearly explained in the student handbook and reviewed regularly in Advocacy class. In line with state mandates, the school regularly conducts fire, earthquake, and intruder drills. With access limited to the front office, our staff ensures that all visitors sign-in, wear ID, and go straight to and from designated locations. The School Safety Plan is revised annually by staff and parents. Included in the plan are monitoring practices that not only address student supervision during school hours, but supervision before and after school as well. The final draft of the current School Safety Plan was adopted by Smedberg's School Site Council in October 2024.

Specialized Programs

At Smedberg Middle School, our Special Education teachers work collaboratively with our General Education teachers through consultation outside the classroom and working in tandem with them in the classroom. While in their own classroom, Special Education teachers specialize in working with small groups of students, utilizing strategies that address the specific learning needs of their students. Additionally, English Language (EL) students are provided direct English Language Development instruction or specialized instruction in EL classes if they are new to our country. Additional support for EL students is provided through our after school EL Academic Support Program.
