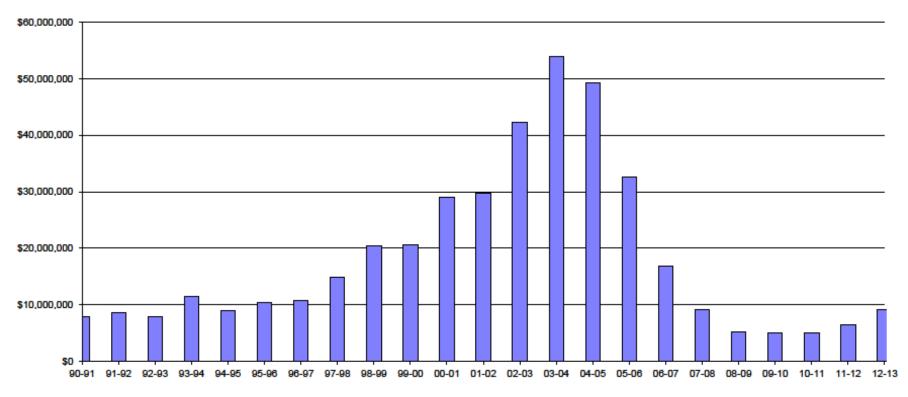
### EGUSD Funding Formula



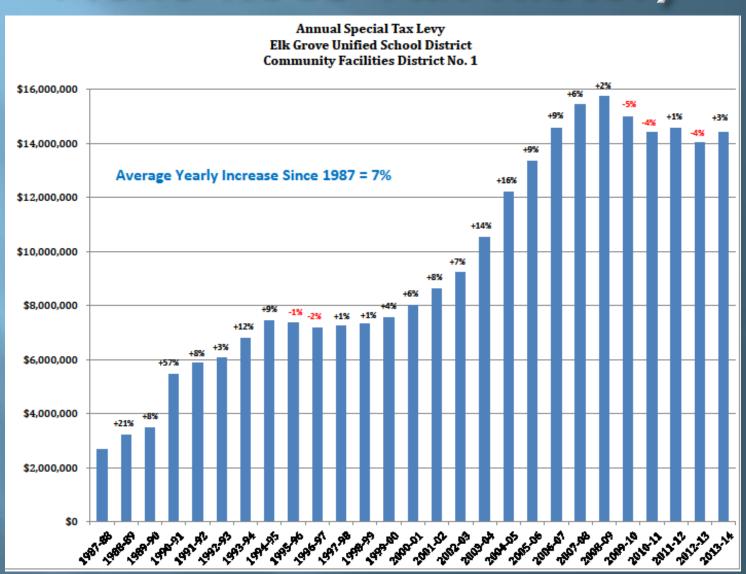

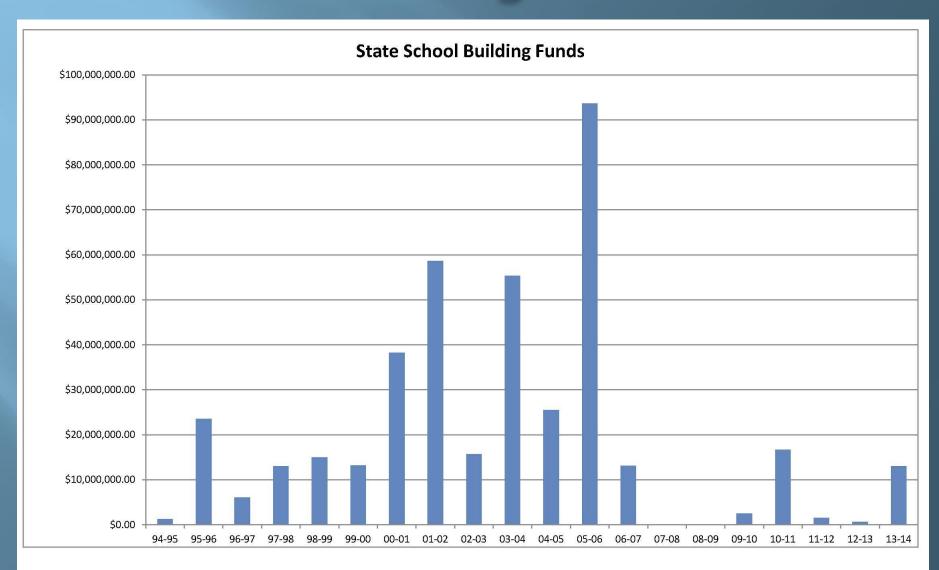
**Developer Fees Collected Per Fiscal Year** 



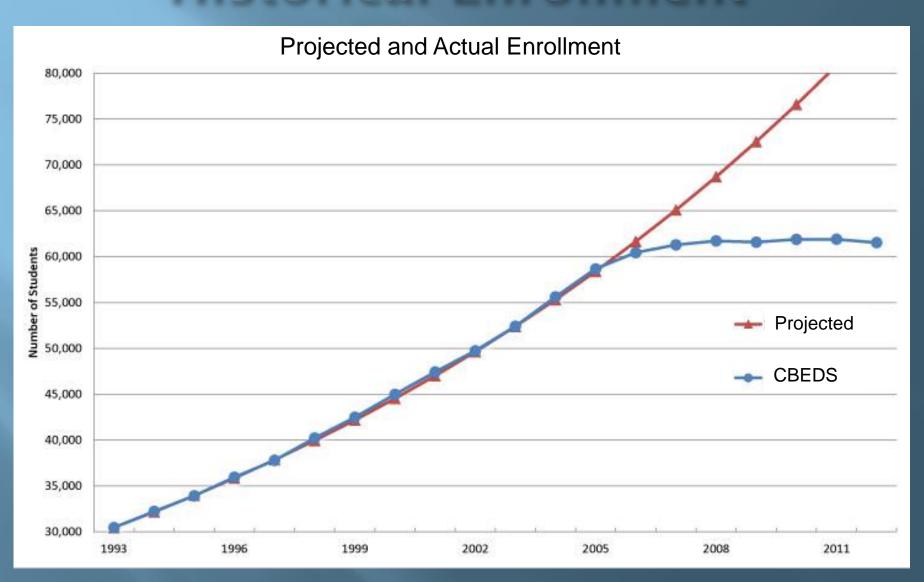
### Mello Roos Tax History



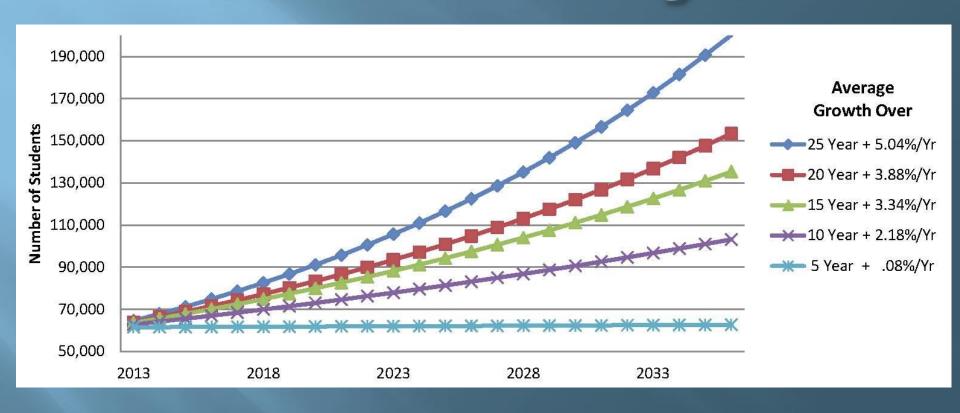

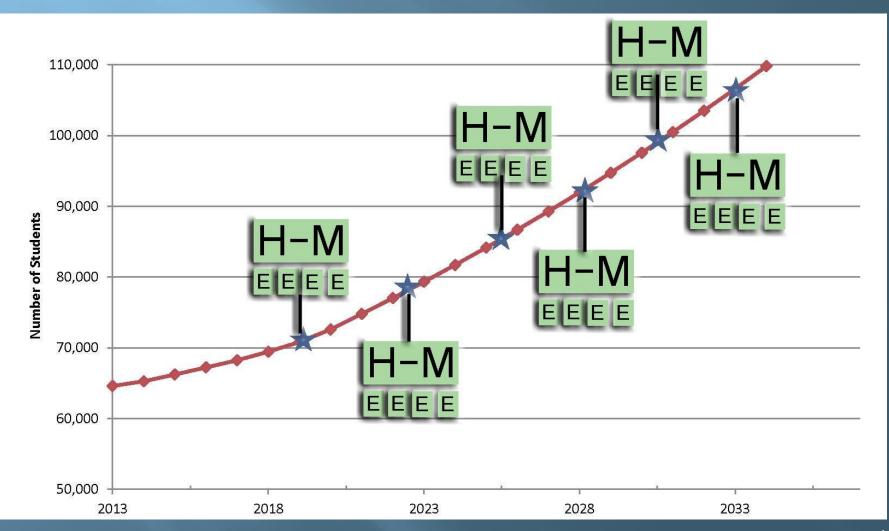

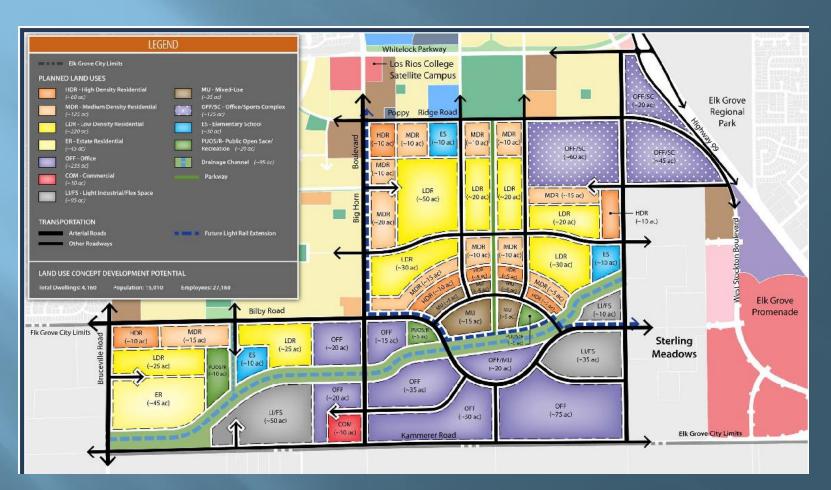

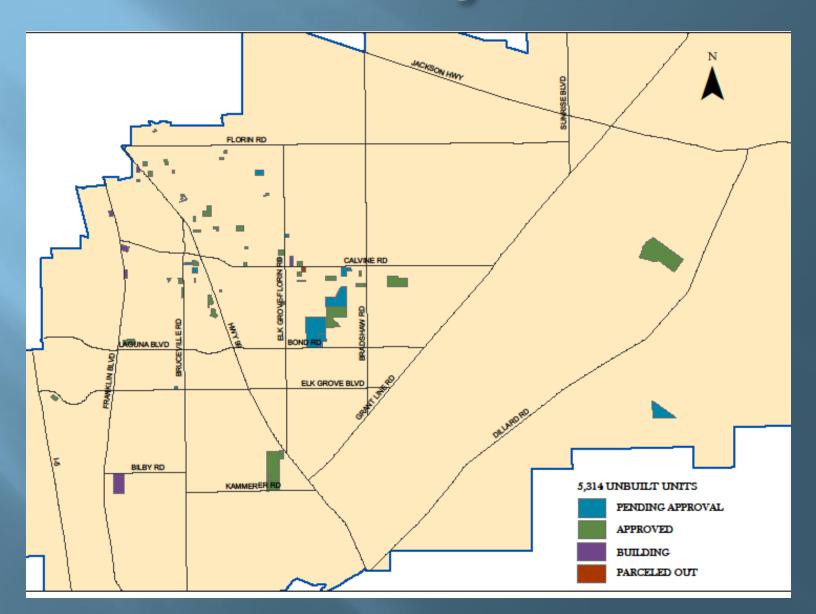

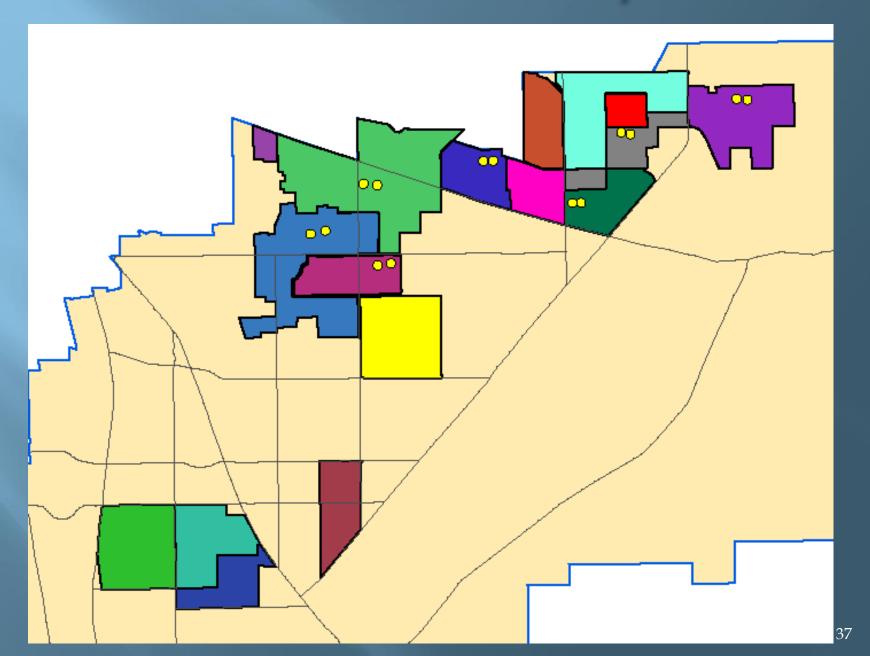

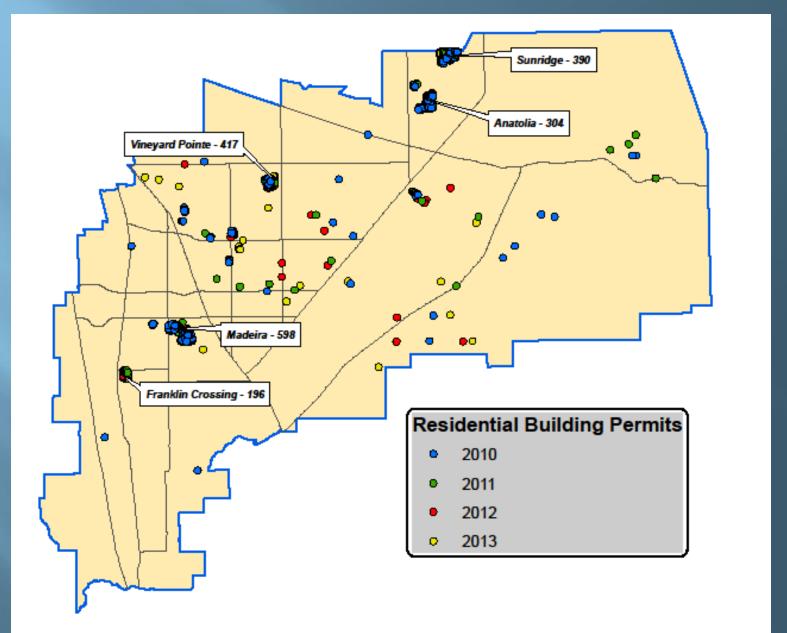
# Planned Future Elementary Schools



# Planned Future Secondary Schools

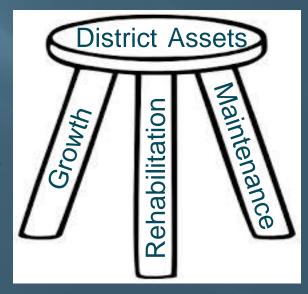


## Homes Built 2010-2013
