The Board is requested to recognize the academic achievement of Arthur C. Butler Elementary School, selected as a 2014 California Distinguished School.

Discussion:

I am pleased to inform the Board of Education that on April 30, 2014, State Superintendent, Tom Torlakson, announced that Arthur C. Butler Elementary was awarded the honor of being designated a 2014 California Distinguished School.

Elementary and secondary schools are recognized during alternate years and this year, Arthur C. Butler Elementary participated in the rigorously competitive selection process conducted by the California Department of Education.

Arthur C. Butler Elementary is one of 6 elementary schools in Sacramento County being recognized as a 2014 Distinguished Schools. Action Requested:

The Board, acting on behalf of the Elk Grove Unified School District Community Facilities District No. 1, is asked to (1) receive the 2014-2015 Elk Grove Unified School District Community Facilities District Tax Report, (2) receive input from property owners appealing a specific parcel tax, (3) conduct a first reading of Ordinance No. 1, 2014-2015, and (4) continue the item to the regular meeting of August 19, 2014, for adoption.

Discussion:

Administration has prepared the 2014-2015 Elk Grove Unified School District Community Facilities District Tax Report, which sets the tax rate for each parcel within the District. The rate is based on information on each parcel in the District and tax formulas established by the passage of Measure A on April 28, 1987, and again on March 10, 1998, with amendments. The Tax Report will be used by the County of Sacramento to prepare tax bills and collect tax revenues for the 2014-2015 tax year. The Mello-Roos Act requires that the Board, acting on behalf of the Elk Grove Unified School District Community Facilities District No. 1, adopt the Tax Report as a regular agenda item. The Act requires that the action taken by the Board is in the form of adopting an ordinance. Ordinance No. 1, 2014-2015, when adopted by the Board, allows the Administration to make changes to the Tax Report in response to appeals from taxpayers, or, otherwise, to correct errors in the application of the special tax to particular parcels.

The Administration requests that the Board conduct a first reading of Ordinance No. 1, 2014-2015 (Exhibit A). The Board should conduct a final reading and adoption of the Ordinance on August 19, 2014.

The Financial Plan, adopted on January 26, 1987, allows for the appeal of the tax rate for a parcel. The Board should receive input from the public regarding appeals of a specific tax for a parcel of land only. The actual tax formula cannot be appealed since the formula was established by the electorate when they approved Measure A. All appeals should be directed to the Administration for consideration and the Board should proceed with the adoption of the Tax Report and Ordinance No. 1, 2014-2015 (Exhibit A).

The 2014-2015 Tax Report continues the current and maximum tax rate of \$3.82 per month (or \$45.84 per year) for "existing" development and \$9.82 per month (or \$117.84 per year) for "future" development per equivalent taxable unit according to the manner specified in Resolution No. 27, 1986-87. Due to the March 10, 1998, bond election, future development occurring from July 1, 1998 – June 30, 2001 will be assessed at \$15.00 per month (or \$180.00 per year) per taxable unit and future development occurring from July 1, 2001, will be assessed \$16.67 per month (or \$200.00 per year) per taxable unit.

The attached summary of the Tax Report indicates <u>preliminary</u> tax revenue information. The Tax Report will be delivered to the Sacramento County Auditor's Office no later than August 22, 2014. The Senior Citizen/Disabled Person Tax Reduction period will close on June 30, 2014. Those who did not renew by that date will have their reduction deleted from the tax roll. Therefore, the "Senior Reductions" number is expected to change and the change will be reflected in the August 19, 2014, Board Item.

ORDINANCE NO. 1, 2014-2015

An Ordinance of the Board of Education of the Elk Grove Unified School District, Acting on Behalf of the Elk Grove Unified School District Community Facilities District No. 1, Approving the Elk Grove Unified School District Community Facilities District No. 1 Tax Report, Fiscal Year 2014-2015, and Levying and Apportioning the Special Tax as Provided Therein.

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Elk Grove Unified School District (the "Board") on January 26, 1987, duly adopted its Resolution No. 27, 1986-87 (the "Resolution") reconfirming the establishment of the Elk Grove Unified School District Community Facilities District No. 1 (the "Community Facilities District") for the purpose of providing for the financing of certain facilities in and for the Community Facilities District and providing for the levy of a special tax in and for the Community Facilities District; and

WHEREAS, at elections held in the Community Facilities District on April 28, 1987, and March 10, 1998, the qualified electors therein duly authorized the levy and collection of a special tax to be used for the purpose of paying the costs of such facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Elk Grove Unified School District Community Facilities District No. 1 Tax Report, Fiscal Year 2014-2015, (the "Tax Report") has been submitted to the Board, and the Board has determined to approve the Tax Report and to levy the special tax at the rates specified in the Tax Report and to apportion them in the manner specified in the Resolution;

- **NOW, THEREFORE,** the Board of Education of the Elk Grove Unified School District, acting on behalf of the Elk Grove Unified School District Community Facilities District No. 1, ordains as follows:
- SECTION 1. The Elk Grove Unified School District Community Facilities District No. 1 Tax Report, Fiscal Year 2014-2015, in the form submitted to this meeting and on file with the Board, is hereby approved and adopted. The Superintendent and his designees are hereby authorized to make changes to the Tax Report in response to appeals from taxpayers, or, otherwise, in order to correct errors in the application of the special tax to particular parcels.
- **SECTION 2.** Pursuant to Section 53340 of the Government Code of the State of California, the special tax is hereby levied at the rates specified in the Tax Report and is hereby apportioned in the manner specified in the Resolution (and as more particularly described in the Tax Report).
- SECTION 3. The Superintendent shall deliver the Tax Report, together with a certified copy of this Ordinance, to the Auditor of the County of Sacramento no later than August 22, 2014.
- **SECTION 4.** Pursuant to Section 53340 of the Government Code for the State of California, the special tax shall be collected by the Tax Collector of the County of Sacramento in the same manner as ordinary <u>ad valorem</u> property taxes are collected and shall be subject to the same procedure, sale, and lien priority in case of delinquency as is provided for <u>ad valorem</u> taxes.
- <u>SECTION 5.</u> In order to have the tax levied hereby collected in the next tax collection period and thereby available to finance the facilities approved by the electors of the Community Facilities District, the Tax Report, together with an ordinance which has been duly adopted and is in effect, must be delivered to the Auditor of the County of Sacramento no later than August 22, 2014.

Facilities Condition Assessment for Facilities Master Plan and Prop. 39 Energy Assessments and Planning

Action Requested:

The Board of Education is asked to consider (1) a Consultant Services Agreement with Jacobs for the facilities condition assessment of District facilities; and (2) move the item forward for adoption at the July 1, 2014, regular Board of Education meeting.

Discussion:

A facilities master plan provides a framework and broad-based system for coordination and development of individual facility projects. It anticipates future needs, defines characteristics of facilities which are needed to support the District's educational mission, and identifies the funding and resources needed to implement facility projects. As reported in the Facilities Master Plan Update presented December 10, 2013, an assessment of the physical and operational condition of existing building systems at all school sites is an important and necessary step in long-term planning for modernization, rehabilitation and maintenance programs employed to keep our facilities updated, clean, maintained at a high level, and capable to provide a safe, comfortable and secure learning environment.

Facilities and Planning Staff prepared a request for proposal (RFP) seeking qualified consultant firms or teams to observe, assess and evaluate the physical condition and likely remaining service life of major building systems and elements, as well as the overall condition and educational adequacy its school facilities. The RFP outlined a 3-step selection process. Twenty-two responses were received initially, pared to 7 responses in the second round. Of these, 4 teams were interviewed and 2 finalists submitted a mock-up assessment report. After review and evaluation of all responses, Administration is pleased to recommend Jacobs to be selected to perform the "Facilities Condition Assessment for Facilities Master Plan and Prop. 39 Energy Assessments and Planning".

Staff is very pleased to recommend Jacobs for this very important project which will include an impressive software and database containing not only districtwide detailed facility assessments for the purposes of ongoing maintenance, modernization and facility enhancement needs but for the critical component of the district's updated masterplan as well as our Proposition 39 assessments. Staff is also pleased with our unique ability to leverage funding opportunities for this important endeavor including Proposition 39 planning funds and SMUD incentives as well as various district resources.

It is recommended that on July 1, 2014, the Board ratify the Consultant Services Agreement with Jacobs and authorize Robert Pierce, Associate Superintendent, Facilities and Planning to finalize and execute the Consultant Services Agreement on behalf of the District.

Rancho Murieta Community Church License Agreement for Entry and Access

Action Requested:

The Board of Education is asked to (1) ratify a License Agreement with the Rancho Murieta Community Church for entry and access to the property immediately adjacent to Cosumnes River Elementary School under certain conditions; and (2) authorize Robert Pierce, Associate Superintendent, Facilities and Planning to finalize and execute the License Agreement on behalf of the District.

Discussion:

On February 17, 2009, the Governing Board adopted Resolution No. 54, 2008-09 approving the Purchase of Real Property for the New Cosumnes River Elementary School Site. At that time a condition of the Purchase and Sale Agreement (PSA) was for the District to record an Entry and Access Easement for the benefit of the adjacent property to the west. The recorded easement grants access for the purposes of agricultural use, and/or for not more than ten (10) residential parcels, and/or for personal access for members of the William Ledbetter Trust (WLT). At that time it was anticipated that these uses would be appropriate for the purposes of a future sale or development of the parcel.

The WLT has since listed the subject property and the Rancho Murieta Community Church (RMCC) has made an offer which has been accepted by the WLT. One of the matters requiring resolution prior to escrow closing is the matter of access. Clearly entry and access was addressed in the aforementioned PSA however it was not anticipated by the District or the WLT that the adjacent property would be used for anything other than for personal use by the WLT, future residential, or agriculture.

Staff has been working with the school site administration, the WLT, and the RMCC to explore ideas and options. Staff believes that the use of the adjacent property as a church is superior to any of the allowable uses of the property covered under the existing easement and zoning. But as previously explained the existing easement and right of entry and access agreement does not allow for a church. As a result Staff is recommending that the Board grant the RMCC entry and access to the adjacent property if and when it acquires title to the property and including County of Sacramento approval and all applicable permitting for the church project's development as well as actual construction and occupancy of the church amongst various other provisions covered in the attached License Agreement.

Some of the benefits of granting entry and access to RMCC are as follows:

- The use of the property by the church is more desirable than the many agricultural uses allowed under such zoning.
- The use of the property by the church is more desirable than ten individual residential lots which will require many points of contact and coordination throughout the school year and the potential for daily challenges.
- By granting this access the District would play a large part in controlling who the adjacent property owner is and what the land use becomes.
- This proposed separate agreement would allow the District to benefit from items not covered or called for under the existing entry and access easement, such as shared road maintenance and long term repairs to be shared by the adjacent property owner.
- The RMCC is a trusted community partner and as such having the RMCC as a neighbor will provide for increased security and community/educational partnership opportunities for Cosumnes River Elementary School and the District.
- The RMCC has agreed to allow the school to use its parking lot(s) when large school events take place. Even with all of the additional parking provided for the new school, there are times when parents and visitors must park either on or across Jackson Highway along Keifer Boulevard.

LICENSE AGREEMENT

This License Agreement ("Agreement"), executed and entered into as of July [___], 2014 (the "Effective Date") is by and between the Elk Grove Unified School District ("District") and The Rancho Murieta Community Church ("Church"). District and Church are sometimes referred to herein each as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties."

Recitals

- 1. District is a school district serving the K-12 student housing and educational needs within its jurisdiction, including those on its Cosumnes River Elementary School campus, located at 13580 Jackson Rd., Sloughhouse, California (the "Property"); and
- 2. Church is a California nonprofit religious corporation and owner of an approximately []-acre parcel of land adjacent to the Property, located at [], Sloughhouse, California (the "Adjacent Property"); and
- 3. Church has requested, and District is interested in granting, a license for Access (defined below) through and use of the Property to provide ingress and egress to the Adjacent Property for Church personnel, Church patrons, and such other persons required to access the Adjacent Property for the development, construction and operation of a church facility, upon the terms and conditions described in this Agreement. The proposed church facility and various related improvements are represented in the site plan attached hereto as Exhibit A.
- 4. This Agreement will only be valid and in effect when executed by both parties and if and when the Church takes title to the Adjacent Property immediately adjacent to the west of the Property and if and when the Church receives all required permits and approvals by all appropriate agencies and develops and occupies the proposed church. This agreement is only valid with the Church and will be null and void should the Church fail to receive all necessary approvals including the County and/or Cal Trans approval of the access road as primary access for the Church, or should the Church fail to develop the site or if an entity other than the Church should, at any time, take title to the Adjacent Property or occupy the property by way of lease, rent, or other similar means.

ACCORDINGLY, the Parties agree as follows:

Agreement

Section 1. Grant of License; Description of Property Subject to License. District does hereby grant Church during the Initial Term and each Renewal Term, a nonexclusive, limited license ("License") for access ("Access") through and use of the Property to provide ingress and egress to the Adjacent Property for Church personnel, Church patrons, and such other persons required to access the Adjacent Property for the operation of a church facility, subject to the limitations on use set forth in Section 4. The

initial portion of the Property subject to the License ("License Area") is the section of the Property designated on and represented by the diagram attached hereto as Exhibit B. District, in District's sole discretion and subject to its potential future construction and schoolsite needs, shall have the right to relocate, upon reasonable notice to Church, the License Area to a suitable location on the Property in lieu of the License Area shown in Exhibit A during the Initial Term or any Renewal Term (each as defined in Section 3) of this Agreement. In such event, Church and District shall negotiate the sharing of costs of such relocation of the License Area pursuant to a separate written agreement.

- Section 2. Fee. The Church agrees that in return for Access rights as defined in this Agreement that the Church will pay for its share of required maintenance and repairs of the Access Road (defined in Exhibit B) as needed and defined in Section 7. In addition Church agrees to allow the School utilization of the Church parking lot(s) at various times throughout the school year so long as such use does not conflict with Church programs and as coordinated with/by the School Principal and Church Leadership. Church also agrees to allow the School access to the Adjacent Property for the purposes of river and nature area access for appropriate lessons and class projects. In addition the School will allow the Church utilization of the School parking lot as an overflow option for the Church. This use will be limited to non-school hours and at times that do not conflict with any school activities. Such use will be coordinated with the School Principal.
- Section 3. Term: Termination. The initial term of this Agreement ("Initial Term") shall be twenty-five (25) years, commencing and effective upon the Effective Date and ending on the last day of the twenty-five (25) year period thereafter (i.e., ending July [11], 2039. This Agreement shall automatically renew immediately after the end of the Initial Term for successive ten (10) year periods (each, a "Renewal Term"), unless earlier terminated by the Parties. This Agreement may be terminated, without penalty or cause, mutually by the Parties and at any time during the Initial Term or any Renewal Term, upon thirty (30) days' written notice from each party delivered to the other Party at the address shown in Section 10.

Section 4. <u>Limitations on Use of Property; District Approvals.</u>

- (a) During the Initial Term and any Renewal Term, the Access shall be limited solely to Church personnel, Church patrons, and such other persons required to access the Adjacent Property for the operation of a church facility. This Access as well as anticipated volumes and types of service and access are generally defined in Exhibit C. Any exceptions or revisions to the level or types of Access described in Exhibit C will be coordinated and approved by the District.
- (b) Church expressly acknowledges that, by reason of the use of the Property as a schoolsite, District has a legitimate interest in overseeing the development and use of the Property and the License Area. Consequently, all matters relating to construction, design, improvement, restoration, repairs, signage, operation, management, maintenance, and use of the Property and the License Area (including any proposed assignment of the limited license granted herein) shall be subject to the discretion of the District.

- **Section 5.** Representations and Warranties of Church. Church hereby represents and warrants to District as follows:
- (a) Church is a nonprofit religious corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of California with full right, power and authority to enter into and perform its obligations under this Agreement;
- (b) Church is, or shall become within 120 days of the Effective Date, the sole owner in fee title of the Adjacent Property;
- (c) Church (i) has obtained, or shall obtain within 365 days of the Effective Date, all required approvals, licenses, permits, and entitlements, and (ii) has fulfilled, or shall fulfill within 730 days of the Effective Date, other requirements to the ownership and operation of church facilities on the Adjacent Property including the start of construction of the church; and
- (d) Church has conducted its own independent investigation with respect to the condition of the Property, and reached its own determination of the feasibility of Church's use of the Property and the suitability of the License Area for such purposes.
- **Section 6.** <u>General Responsibilities and Covenants of Church</u>. Church hereby covenants, for the benefit of District, as follows:
- (a) Church shall act in a professional manner and shall not do or permit anything to be done on or about the Property which would obstruct or interfere with the rights of anyone on or about the Property, or which is or may be a nuisance, annoyance, inconvenience, or which may injure anyone on or about the Property or surrounding neighborhoods.
- (b) Church shall not use or permit the License Area or any portion thereof to be used in any manner or for any purpose that is in any way in violation of any applicable law, ordinance, policy, or regulation of any federal, state, county, or local government agency, body or entity, including District. This includes, but is not limited to, any smoking or alcohol consumption on or about the License Area. Church shall also not permit anything to be done on or about the License Area which will increase the existing rate of insurance upon the Property, or cause the cancellation of any insurance policy covering the Property, and Church shall be responsible for paying any increase in insurance caused thereby.
- (c) Church shall, at Church's own cost and expense, comply with all applicable statutes, ordinances, regulation, and requirements of all governmental entities, including federal, state, county or municipal, and whether those statutes, ordinances, regulations, and requirements are now in force or are subsequently enacted. If any license, permit, or other governmental authorization is required for the lawful use of the License Area, Church shall procure and maintain at its sole cost any such license, permit or other governmental authorization prior to the commencement of such use and throughout the term of this Agreement. Upon District's request, Church shall provide District with copies of all licenses which Church may require in order for District to

verify that Church is in compliance with the requirements of this section.

- (d) Church shall, ensure that all construction related activities on Adjacent Property including the "tie in" to Access Road be coordinated with the District and that all planning and construction activities affecting District property be properly reviewed with and approved by the District.
- (e) Church shall, provide parking for occasional School activities as described in Section 2.
- (f) Church shall, provide occasional river and/or nature area access for School activities and lessons as described in Section 2.
- (g) Church shall not, operate a Pre K-12 school in any form on Adjacent Property and therefore may not use License Access for such purposes.
- (h) Church shall not, use License Area for purposes of construction access or for construction related traffic for the construction of the new church or any future renovations, additions or modifications to the Adjacent Property. A temporary construction access road or alternative access point shall be utilized for any such activities.

Section 7. Repairs and Maintenance.

- (a) Church shall be responsible for all costs and shall perform, or cause to be performed, the following improvements and repairs to the Property ("Repairs") as necessary to serve or access the Adjacent Property:
 - (i) Any required signaling, signage or other improvements required by the County of Sacramento or any other entity required to grant approval or permits for the development of the church.; and
 - (ii) any and all required fencing or gate improvements necessary to serve the Adjacent Property; and
 - (iii) any required permitting or inspections relating to the foregoing Repairs;
- (b) During the Initial Term and any Renewal Term, District shall provide for maintenance and repairs to the License Area, including all fencing, road repair, infrastructure and all landscaping for the related Property. Church agrees to share fifty percent (50%) of the reasonable costs of all such maintenance and repairs described in this Section 6(b), which shall be payable within sixty (60) days of presentment of an invoice from District detailing such maintenance and repairs. The maintenance and repairs described in this Section 6(b) are exclusive of the Repairs described in Section 6(a).

Section 8. Indemnification. Church accepts all responsibility for loss or damage to any person or entity, and to defend and hold harmless and release District, its officers, agents and employees, from and against any and all actions, claims, damages, disabilities or expenses, including attorneys' fees and costs through trial and on appeal, that may be asserted by any person or entity, arising out of this Agreement and/or in connection with the tortuous acts, errors, or omissions of Church, its officers, agents, employees, participants, volunteers, and invitees, whether or not there is concurrent passive or active negligence on the part of District, but excluding liability due to the sole negligence or willful misconduct of District. This indemnification obligation is not limited in any way by any limitation on the amount or type of damages or compensation payable to or for Church or its agents under workers' compensation acts, disability benefit acts, or other employee benefit acts. Church shall also be liable to District for any loss or damage to District's property (including, without limitation, the Property) arising from or in connection with Church's performance and activities under this Agreement. The foregoing indemnification obligations shall survive the expiration or earlier termination of this Agreement. In the event that the School is accessing the Church property for parking or for any events (i.e. river and/or nature access) the District will provide Church with the same indemnification required of the Church for such activities.

In the event of the School accessing the Church property for purposes of parking or for any other events allowed in this Agreement (i.e. river and/or nature access) District accepts all responsibility for loss or damage to any person or entity, and to defend and hold harmless and release Church, its officers, agents and employees, from and against any and all actions, claims, damages, disabilities or expenses, including attorneys' fees and costs through trial and on appeal, that may be asserted by any person or entity, arising out of this Agreement and/or in connection with the tortuous acts, errors, or omissions of District, its officers, agents, employees, participants, volunteers, and invitees, whether or not there is concurrent passive or active negligence on the part of Church, but excluding liability due to the sole negligence or willful misconduct of Church. This indemnification obligation is not limited in any way by any limitation on the amount or type of damages or compensation payable to or for District or its agents under workers' compensation acts, disability benefit acts, or other employee benefit acts. District shall also be liable to Church for any loss or damage to Church's property (including, without limitation, the Property) arising from or in connection with District's performance and activities under this Agreement. The foregoing indemnification obligations shall survive the expiration or earlier termination of this Agreement.

Section 9. <u>Insurance</u>. Church shall provide District with a certificate of insurance designating District as "additional insured" for the Initial Term and each Renewal Term of this Agreement for all incidents occurring on the Property in connection with or relating to Access. The minimum insurance coverage limits shall be as follows: (1) bodily injury, \$1,000,000 per incident; (2) property damage, \$1,000,000 per incident; (3) automobile \$1,000,000 per incident; and (4) general liability aggregate, \$2,000,000. Each insurance carrier must be acceptable to District. In the event that the School is accessing the Church property for parking or for any events (i.e. river and/or nature access) the District will provide the Church with a certificate of insurance at the same levels required of the Church.

Section 10. <u>Notices.</u> All notices given by either Party to the other Party under this Agreement shall be in writing and either delivered in person or by mail to the following respective address:

- **Section 11.** Assignment; Delegation. Church shall not assign or transfer any of its rights, burdens, duties or obligations under this Agreement, nor shall Church be permitted to delegate its performance obligations, without the prior written consent of District.
- Section 12. Governing Law; Venue. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California. Any action or proceeding seeking any relief under or with respect to this Agreement shall be brought solely in Superior Court of the State of California for Sacramento County.
- Section 13. Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the sole and entire agreement between the Parties with respect to the subject matter dealt with in this Agreement and all understandings, oral or written, with respect to the subject matter of this Agreement are hereby superseded.
- **Section 14.** <u>Future Assurances</u>. Each Party shall cooperate and take such actions as may reasonably be required by the other Party in order to carry out the provisions of this Agreement and the transactions contemplated by this Agreement.
- Section 15. Waiver. The failure by either Party to enforce any term or provision of this Agreement shall not constitute a waiver of that term or provision, or any other term or provision. No waiver by either Party of any term or provision of this Agreement shall be deemed or shall constitute a waiver of any other provision of this Agreement, nor shall any waiver constitute a continuing waiver unless otherwise expressly provided in writing.
- **Section 16.** <u>Severability</u>. In the event any clause, sentence, term or provision of this Agreement shall be held by any court of competent jurisdiction to be illegal, invalid, or unenforceable for any reason, the remaining portions of this Agreement shall nonetheless remain in full force and effect.

- **Section 17.** Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be an original, but all of which shall constitute one instrument. Any executed counterpart may be delivered by facsimile transmission with the same effect as if an originally executed counterpart had been delivered.
- **Section 18.** Amendments. This Agreement may be amended only by a writing signed by each of the Parties hereto.
- Section 19. <u>Binding Agreement</u>. All terms and provisions of this Agreement shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of, and be enforceable by, the respective permitted assigns and successors of the Parties.
- **Section 20.** <u>Incorporation of Exhibits</u>. All exhibits attached hereto are incorporated herein by reference.
- **Section 21.** <u>Board Approval</u>. This Agreement confers no legal rights until it is approved by District's Governing Board at a lawfully conducted public meeting.
- Section 22. Warranty of Authority. Each person below warrants and guarantees that s/he is legally authorized to execute this Agreement on behalf of the designated entity and that such execution shall bind the designated entity to the terms of this Agreement.



Note, this discretion does not exist in relation to violations of the District's policy and Training Rules regarding use or possession of tobacco, drugs, alcohol and performance enhancing drugs, addressed on page 10 of this Handbook, for which there are minimum punishments for 1st and 2nd offenses that neither the coach, school or District staff has the discretion to reduce.

Handbook, page 10, Training Rules (top of page)

TRAINING RULES

For health and safety reasons, students should understand that the ECUSD believes that the use of tobacco, alcohol, drugs, and performance enhancing drugs and supplements is not acceptable for high school athletes. Any violation of these Training Rules may also result in school disciplinary action according to the EGUSD Gode of Conduct, EGUSD discipline policies, and regulations, and the California Education Code. The coaches believe that the current glamorization of the use of tobacco, alcohol and drugs by some professional athletes is misleading and believe that high school students should be aware of the negative effects of their use.

The following information concerning tobacco, alcohol drugs and performance enhancing drugs and supplement use is governed by this District-approved Student-Athlete and Parent Handbook, and is binding on all District student-athletes. is the policy adopted by the Athletic Departments and the District Administration of the EGUSD. It is a policy designed to be supportive and helpful to students/athletes, not just punitive. Students and parents must realize that it is their responsibility to follow this policy, and repeated offenses during the season or at off-season team activities will result in progressive consequences.

Handbook, page 10. Training Rules (bottom of page; second to last paragraph)

The 1st and 2nd offense consequences listed above are the minimum punishment for violations of the EGUSD Training Rules. As such, coaches, schools administrators, athletic directors, District staff, and Board have no discretion to reduce the respective minimum punishments set forth herein for 1st or 2nd offenses of the Training Rules. This said, a coach has discretion to impose a more serious punishment, including removal of a student-athlete from the team. In the instance that removal from a team is not the minimum punishment called for by the Training Rules, such a decision is subject to discretion of the District's Athletic Director, subject to review by the District's Superintendent or designee. The Superintendent's (or designee's) decision shall be final.

Various paragraphs or sections in the Agreement for Team Participation, located on pages 14 and 15 of the Handbook


1. It is a privilege, not a right, to participate in extra-curricular activities, including Team Activities. The privilege may be revoked at any time, for any reason that does not violate Federal or State law, or District policies or procedures. There is no guarantee that the Student will make a Team, remain on a Team, or actively participate in Team events, shows, performances, or competitions. Such matters shall remain exclusively within the judgment and discretion of the supervising District employee or volunteer coach, except for those minimum punishments described in the District's Student-Athlete and Parent Handbook for a violation of the Training Rules on use of possession of tobacco, drugs, alcohol, or performance enhancing drugs, such minimum punishments must be imposed and there is no discretion to reduce those punishments.

3. The Student shall comply with the instruction and directions of Team Activity teachers, coaches, supervisors, chaperones, and instructors. During the Student's participation in Team Activities, as well as adademic and/or other school activities, the Student shall comply with all applicable Godes of Conduct, including the Training Rules regarding use or possession of tobacco, drugs, alcohol and performance enhancing drugs. The Student shall also generally conduct himself/herself at all times in keeping with the highest moral and ethical standards so as to reflect positively on himself/herself, the Team and the District. Failure to meet these obligations may, in the discretion of the District, result in removal from the Team and/or Team Activities. Should the Student's violation of these obligations result in socially injury or property damage, the Adult agrees to (a) pay to restore or replace the damaged property, (b) pay for bodily injury damages to an individual, and (c) defend, protect and hold the District harmless from such claims. Notwith standing the stated discretion of the District in terms of removal of the Student from the Team and/or Team Activities, the coaches, school, or District has no discretion to reduce the minimum purishments called for in the District's Student-Athlete and Parent Handbook for violation of Training Rules regarding use or possession of tobacco, drugs, alcohol and performance enhancing drugs.

9. This Agreement is to be broadly construed to enforce the purposes and agreements set forth above, and shall not be construed against the Released Parties solely on the basis that this Agreement was drafted by the District. If any part of this Agreement is deemed invalid or ineffective, all other provisions shall remain in force. No oral modification of this Agreement, or alleged change or modification of its terms by subsequent conduct or oral statement, is allowed. This Agreement, and the District's Student-Athlete and Parent Handbook, the terms of which are incorporated herein and

considered part of this Agreement, contain the sole and exclusive understanding of the parties, with no other representation relied upon by the Adult or Student in determining whether to execute this Agreement or in agreeing to participate in Team Activities.

AS THE ADULT SIGNING BELOW: (1) I AM GIVING UP SUBSTANTIAL ACTUAL OR POTENTIAL RIGHTS IN ORDER TO ALLOW THE STUDENT TO PARTICIPATE IN TEAM ACTIVITIES; (2) I HAVE SIGNED THIS AGREEMENT WITHOUT ANY INDUCEMENT OR ASSURANCE OF ANY NATURE, AND WITH FULL APPRECIATION OF THE RISKS, INHERENT IN TEAM ACTIVITIES; (3) I HAVE NO QUESTION REGARDING THE SCOPE OR INTENT OF THIS AGREEMENT, INCLUDING THE WAY IN WHICH THIS AGREEMENT OPERATES IN TANDEM WITH THE TERMS, CONDITIONS AND REQUIREMENTS SET FORTH IN THE DISTRICT'S STUDENT-ATHLETE AND PARENT HANDBOOK; (4), AS A PARENT OR DEGAL GUARDIAN, HAVE THE RIGHT AND AUTHORITY TO ENTER INTEGITIES AGREEMENT, AND TO BIND MYSELF, THE STUDENT, AND ANY OTHER FAMILY MEMBER, PERSONAL REPRESENTATIVE, ASSIGN, HEIR, TRUSTEE, OR GUARDIAN TO THE TERMS OF THIS AGREEMENT AND I HAVE EXPLAINED THIS AGREEMENT TO THE STUDENT, WHO

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING Addendum to MOU of January 23, 2012 through June 30, 2014

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is between the **Sacramento County Office of Education**, referred to as "SCOE" and the **Elk Grove Unified School** District, referred to as "EGUSD."

The purpose of this MOU is to outline the roles and responsibilities of SCOE and the EGUSD in regard to the continued assignment of:

Diane Lampe

to the Prevention & Student Services Department of the Sacramento County Office of Education, 10474 Mather Blvd., P.O. Box 269003, Sacramento, CA 95826-9003, to assist in the development and implementation of *Regional & Statewide Activities Coordination of the K-12 Student Mental Health Initiative (SMHI)* and related student mental health efforts, including *Creating Community Solutions* and *Sacramento County Bullying Prevention and Youth Mental Health First Aid* programs. The purpose of the SMHI is to develop the capacity of regions and counties to implement effective, sustainable student mental health programs and strategies, with a focus on preventing student mental health issues at the elementary level (K-8), with linkages to grades 9 through 12. Creating Community Solutions and Sacramento County Bullying Prevention and Youth Mental Health First Aid are local efforts, designed to coordinate with SMHI activities.

Once signed by all parties, this MOU is in effect from **July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015**. Financial agreements, including purchase orders and budgets will be prepared and approved by both parties for the project period.

The SCOE agrees to:

Provide a primary contact person for all work under this agreement. The primary contact will be:

- Provide funding not to exceed \$112,862* to reimburse EGUSD the actual costs of salary, benefits and EGUSD indirect costs to continue to employ Diane Lampe and assign her position to SCOE. Costs are estimated as follows:
 - July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015 Salary for twelve months, benefits and 5.44% indirect, not to exceed \$112,862*
 *Actual costs will appear in the financial agreements for each period noted above.
- Continue to assign the employee, Diane Lampe, to the management position of Coordinator in the Prevention & Student Services Department to work under the direct supervision of the department director.
- Be responsible for the employee's approved travel expenses related to the SCOE assignment.
- Diane Lampe will remain an employee of the Elk Grove Unified School District and will not gain any status or be eligible for benefits offered only to employees of the Sacramento County Office of Education as a result of this assignment.

The EGUSD agrees to:

Provide a primary contact person for all work performed under this agreement. The primary contact will be:

The assignment of Diane Lampe to the Sacramento County Office of Education during the period of this MOU shall not affect her status and rights as an employee of the Elk Grove Unified School District, and she will be entitled to all pay and allowance, sick leave, vacation, retirement, workers' compensation, retirement health benefits and other benefits offered to the employees of EGUSD.

Indemnity Statement and Agreements

Each party hereto agrees that they shall indemnify, defend and hold the other party and their governing body, officers, agents and employees, harmless from any and all claims, damages, losses, causes of action and demands, including reasonable attorney fees and costs, incurred in connection with or in any manner arising out of the indemnifying party's performance of this Agreement. The indemnifying party, at the indemnifying party's own expense and risk shall defend any and all actions, suits, or other legal proceedings that may be brought or instituted against any other party, the members of their governing body, officers, agents, and employees for any such claims, damages, losses, demands, liabilities, costs or expenses incurred in connection with or in any manner arising out of the indemnifying party's performance of this Agreement. The indemnifying party shall not be liable for damage or injury occasioned by the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the non-indemnifying party and its officers, agents, or employees. This provision shall not be limited to the availability or collectability of insurance coverage.

Neither Elk Grove Unified School District nor the Sacramento County Office of Education shall have any power, right or authority to bind the other to any agreement or obligation or waiver, compromise or settle any account or claim on behalf of the other, or in any manner act on behalf of the other without written authorization to do so.

This MOU shall be amended only in writing and when signed by all parties.

Memorandum of Understanding

Co-Sponsor/District Intern Participating District Agreement

Enclosed is a co-sponsor agreement for your school district Superintendent or Administrator designee to sign and return. When hiring an intern, a co-sponsor agreement between an employing agency and a CA Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CCTC) approved Program Sponsor must be in place in order to comply with CCTC requirements. Intern programs are the result of a partnership between the institution who prepares teachers (Program Sponsor) and the employer. The district or employing agency agrees that there is a need for teachers and that certificated employees will not be displaced when hiring interns. Interns meet the NCLB definition of "highly qualified."

District Interns for the 2014-2015 school year must be employed, provide all required documents and be enrolled in the IMPACT Intern Credential program.

Pursuant to California Education Code 44321, the supervision and support of interns is the responsibility of both the Commission-approved teacher preparation program <u>and</u> the employer. The combination of employer-provided support and mentoring and program supervision provided to the intern must include the following:

- A minimum of 144 hours of support/mentoring and supervision
- A minimum of two hours of support/mentoring and supervision must be provided to an intern teacher every five instructional days.
- An additional 45 hours of support/mentoring and supervision specific to meeting the needs of English learners shall be provided to an intern teacher.

The responsibilities of the district or employing agency shall include the following:

- 1. Employers are responsible for ensuring that the intern they have hired is supported. Prior to an intern assuming daily teaching responsibilities, the employer must identify a mentor or other designated individual who meets the Commission's identified criteria. Adequate supervision is provided by mentor(s) or other designated individuals. One of whom must have the following minimum qualifications:
 - Valid corresponding Clear or Life credential
 - 3 years successful teaching experience
 - EL Authorization (if responsible for providing specified EL support.)
 - a. Sufficient resources are provided including the identification of protected time for employer-provided support/mentor to work with the intern within the school day including clearly defined expectations for type/frequency of support.

- b. The employer determines the terms of employment for the mentor teacher and additional personnel. It is at the discretion of the employer to determine if the mentor teacher and/or additional personnel receive compensation and if so, compensation is the responsibility of the employer.
- c. To meet the CCTC requirement of 144 hours of required support, the employer will ensure that the intern receives a minimum of 60 hours of support with the mentor teacher and/or additional personnel (if appropriate) per year. Support may include, but is not limited to weekly course planning of curriculum and assessments, coaching within the classroom, and problem-solving regarding student issues. The intern will be responsible for documenting hours received from the employing agency.
- d. For those interns who do not already have English Language Authorization from a current California credential or passing score on an exam (CTEL), the <u>employer</u> will ensure that the intern receives a minimum of 20 hours of the required 45 hours required by CCTC per year related to working with English Learners.
- e. Identify an employee who will be <u>immediately available</u> to assist the intern with planning lessons that are appropriately designed and differentiated for English Learners, for assessing language needs and progress, and for support of language accessible instruction through in-classroom modeling and coaching as needed. The identified individual may be the same mentor that is providing general support and supervision provided that the individual possesses an English learner authorization and will be immediately available to assist the intern teacher in working with English learners.
- 2. The employer will assign a representative (e.g. Assistant Superintendent or site Principal) to act as a contact person to the SJCOE IMPACT Intern Program.
- 3. If appropriate, the employer will assist the SJCOE IMPACT Intern Program Student Account's office to establish monthly payroll deduction of tuition for the intern.
- 4. The employer will provide evaluation data as requested by CCTC and SJCOE IMPACT Intern Program, including survey completion, demographic and/or retention information.
- 5. If SJCOE IMPACT Intern program is unable to provide a Practicum Supervisor due to distance or any unforeseen circumstance, it will be the responsibility of the district to identify an appropriate Practicum Supervisor and assume all expenses related to the position.
- 6. The employing agency will have on file a statement regarding its inability to fill the necessary position/s with certificated employees for which this intern credential is being implemented. In addition, the employing agency will make every effort to ensure that if the intern is placed in a high priority school (e.g. Decile 1, 2 or 3) the percentage of teacher interns in that school is not higher than the district wide average of teacher interns at a school in that year.

The responsibilities of the Program Sponsor, San Joaquin County Office of Education IMPACT Intern Program, shall include the following:

- 1. Identification of a Practicum Supervisor and allocation of additional personnel if needed to provide on-site support for the intern.
 - a. The Practicum Supervisor and additional personnel working with the intern should possess a Clear or Life Credential in the same area as the intern, have a minimum of three years of successful teaching experience, and have English Language Authorization.
 - b. The Program Sponsor will provide appropriate orientation and training for the Practicum Supervisor and additional personnel, including but not limited to characteristics of coaching, time and frequency of visitations, and process for documenting observations and evaluation of intern.
 - c. The Program Sponsor will provide opportunities to fulfill the remaining hours of support needed per year.
 - d. For those interns who do not already have English Language Authorization from a current California credential or passing score on an exam (CTEL), the <u>Program Sponsor will provide opportunities to fulfill the remaining hours of support needed per year specific to the needs of English Learners</u>.
- 2. The Program Sponsor will be responsible for establishing effective and on-going communication with employing agency and SJCOE IMPACT Intern personnel (e.g. Practicum Supervisor, Evaluator, Admissions Coordinator, Dean) as appropriate to ensure a successful teaching experience for the intern.
- 3. The Program Sponsor will be responsible for providing the intern with procedures to document and monitor the CCTC required hours of mentoring and support from the employer and SJCOE IMPACT Intern Program.
- 4. The SJCOE IMPACT Intern Program will provide all CCTC required coursework for the Preliminary Credential and assistance with credentialing issues.

We look forward to providing highly qualified teacher interns to meet your needs.

Tiger Natural Gas, Inc. Purchase Agreement Renewal	

Action Requested:

The Board is asked to approve the Natural Gas Purchase Agreement Renewal between the Elk Grove Unified School District and Tiger Natural Gas, Inc. for the 2014-2015 school year.

Discussion:

Historically the District has purchased its natural gas from a third party provider in an effort to reduce the District's expenditures for natural gas. This is not an uncommon practice, in lieu of purchasing gas from the local utility, in our case Pacific Gas & Electric. In these arrangements, the public entity purchases gas at a reduced rate from a third party below that of the local utility. The District then pays for the transportation of that gas through the local utility's infrastructure. This has proved to be advantageous for the District and Administration seeks to continue this arrangement. This arrangement has saved the District hundreds of thousands in General Fund dollars annually when compared to PG&E rates.

Similar to last year Staff is proposing a month-to-month variable rate until which time the market becomes more stable. As such Staff will conduct routine market reviews to determine whether or not the District should remain at a variable rate or lock the rate to take advantage of a spot price reduction or to avoid any anticipated escalating rates.

Last year the District used 54,569 DThms of natural gas from June 2013 through May 2014. This was a significant decrease over the previous year in which the District used over 67,000. Based on our market analysis, we recommended that Elk Grove use the variable rate.

Financial Summary:

The purchase of natural gas is included in the 2014-2015 budget. Savings will vary based on PG&E's rate compared to Tiger Natural Gas, Inc.
