V. Public Comment

Jaz Kaur informed the Board that she has been advocating for a school counselor at Franklin Elementary for several years. Ms. Kaur shared her concerns and asked for the Board's support.

Kurk shared his concerns about various events and requested that the Board eliminate all UBU, Rainbow and GSA clubs from elementary schools, limiting access to students depending on age and that written consent be required for all students who participate.

Lauren, Erin Phelps, Andi, Tammi, Sam, Laura, Viraj Shah, Stacey, and James Sutter spoke in support of Mr. Bishop, the UBU club at Pleasant Grove Elementary and the positive effects the club has had. Some shared concerns about how the protesters confused and frightened their children and about how this has unfolded. They requested that the Board continue to support the school, develop policy and provide social/emotional support to students.

Heidi shared her concerns about secretive lunchtime UBU clubs at some elementary schools that don't require permission slips or information about the club to parents and about a letter that was sent out to select schools about missing school for a walk-out. Heidi also expressed concerns and about the transportation issues in Area 7 and hoped for a meeting between the district and the parent coalition to address the issue.
